Each of the sentences below contains a subordinate clause. Identify the words which form this subordinate clause and then specify whether it conveys purpose, a command, fear or result.

1. The commander urged the soldiers that they should fight more fiercely.
2. The chief begged the consuls that they should not attack the ships.
3. The consul was afraid that the citizens were fighting in the streets.
4. The army set out so that they might arrive at the camp of the enemy.
5. We captured so many enemies that the general rejoiced loudly.
6. The consul returned home so that he might conceal the crime.
7. I begged the general to such an extent that I did not suffer greatly.
8. The soldiers stayed in the camp so that they might not be wounded by the enemy.
9. The guards were afraid that the captives had escaped.
10. You fought so violently that the enemy did not resist.
