

### Exercise C16.3: Sentences using the subjunctive

Each of the sentences below contains a subordinate clause which would need a subjunctive verb in Latin. The conjunction introducing each subordinate clause has been underlined and the verb in the clause is in bold.

Identify the Latin conjunction and the tense of the subjunctive needed. You will need to think about what type of subordinate clause it is and how the subjunctive behaves in that type of clause.

1. The consuls feared that the citizens **would die**.
2. The guard feared that the captives **had escaped**.
3. The army set out so that **they might arrive** at the camp before night.
4. The senators fled so that **they might not be captured**.
5. The commander ordered the army that **they should advance** towards the sea.
6. The woman begged her sons that **they should not fight** with weapons against the citizens.
7. This consul was so wicked that everyone **supported** that consul.
8. The father had so many enemies that his children **wanted** to escape.
9. When the enemy **had attacked** the camp, the captives were terrified.
10. Since the weapons **had been hidden**, no one was killed on that day.
11. We wanted to know whether the consul **was praising** the commander.
12. The soldiers asked why great rewards **had not been promised** to them.
