## Activity 18.7 - Dryden's version of lines from Chaucer's Prologue

The modern edition scans as a series of well-formed iambic pentameter lines of 10 syllables, provided that we take account of the pronunciation of some final or medial <e> syllables. A word-final <e> is elided before a vowel or <h>.
(This analysis does not imply that the verse would be read aloud as mechanically as it might suggest.)

Some lines of Dryden's version lack sufficient syllables and so cannot be read smoothly, because the spelling has omitted an <e>, which partly accounts for Dryden's criticism. The asterisk <*> marks a deficient syllable in the following lines.

does not scan regularly - 10 syllables but the distribution of accented syllables is wrong
the vowel of ne must be elided - n'arrete
this has only 7 syllables, omitting essential final <e> syllables
