

## Doing a non-systematic review

To produce a non-systematic stand-alone review we have to work through the following steps:

Non-systematic reviews – the steps		
ı	Formulate the research question	
	Find a question that will give focus and direction to your thinking; one that will guide you as you structure and analyse your sources.	
2	Screening – the inclusion and exclusion criteria	
	Translate the research question into inclusion and exclusion criteria.	
3	Searching the literature	
	This needs to be as rigorous and transparent as you can make it, so that others can see exactly what you have done and repeat it if necessary.	
4	Synthesising	
	<ul> <li>First, critically evaluate the methodological quality of the studies and the impact this has on the interpretation of the findings.</li> <li>Second, synthesise the various studies to lay the foundations for your own conclusions.</li> </ul>	
5	Writing the review	
6	Editing	
7	Citing your sources
