Conclusion (3 minutes)

Here you outline the significance of your findings and what now needs to be done.

Acknowledgements (3 minutes)

In an empirical dissertation you will need to acknowledge the help of those who agreed to be the subjects of your study, those who gave you advice on how to analyse the data and, of course, your supervisor and fellow students.
