1	Where does the author get her data/evidence?	<input type="checkbox"/>
2	Is it relevant? Is it sufficient to support her arguments?	<input type="checkbox"/>
3	Has she represented it accurately?	<input type="checkbox"/>
4	Has she drawn the most relevant and consistent inferences from it?	<input type="checkbox"/>
5	Is the argument balanced? Is it fair/biased, objective/subjective?	<input type="checkbox"/>
6	Has she omitted anything?	<input type="checkbox"/>
7	Is the argument consistent?	<input type="checkbox"/>
8	Does she use language accurately? Does she mean different things at different times, when she uses a word?	<input type="checkbox"/>
9	Does she reveal all her assumptions when she uses language or does she take things for granted?	<input type="checkbox"/>
10	Do her arguments support or contradict what others have said? If so, why?	<input type="checkbox"/>
