

## Mastering Arabic: Arabic Dictionaries

### Arabic starter dictionaries

The following dictionaries and online translation sites do not require a knowledge of the Arabic root system. They are useful reference as you become more familiar with the roots. Always try to check the translation with another source, particularly if there are no Arabic short vowels since these can affect the meaning and pronunciation.
