Question 1:
We know what to expect from each other and are more likely hold ourselves to behavioral standards we have agreed with. When problems occur, we can return to the agreement for guidance or clarification.

Question 2:
“Calling In” means respectfully letting another person know they have hurt you or broken an agreement.
“Calling out” means using shame or publicly correcting someone, which can make the situation worse.
Question 3:
“Ouch” something you can say if someone hurts you, or they can say to you if you have hurt them.
“Oops” something you can say as an apology while working hard to not repeat the mistake. No excuses
