Slang is a form of informal speech where groups have a common understanding of meaning for terms.
Slang can be offensive in some circumstances.

Euphemism is similar to slang, but it is a phrase that has common meaning for a group such as “go to the restroom.”
Euphemism is often used to “soften” an embarrassing or private topic.
Question 3:
Can exclude others who don’t understand what you are saying. Can be offensive to some people who hear it. You might not understand the meaning. You might not know the real words.
