<b>Question 1:</b>
Pornography is a form of adult entertainment meant for people over eighteen. It is made to cause sexual excitement in the viewer. It is generally exaggerated and not realistic.
Sexually explicit media includes porn but also movies, TV, online content, books and magazines that have some sexual content.

<b>Question 2:</b>
A teen may be curious and look for sexual content. They may be exposed by a friend or family member, or they may stumble upon it by accident and see content they were not looking for or more than they were looking for.
<b>Question 3:</b>
It can be shocking or overwhelming (too much, too fast, too soon). They may get the wrong ideas about consent, sexual safety, or relationships. They may think that they are supposed to look or act like the actors. They may get in trouble with parents or alienate peers. They may feel ashamed about bodies or sex.
Accept other relevant student thoughts.
<b>Question 4:</b>
These types of media have actors, lighting, and special effects that make sex look unrealistic, which might cause confusion, body shame or other problems for a teen.
Consent, safer sex practices, and pregnancy prevention are mostly absent from this content. Very little communication about what a person likes or wants is shown. The behaviors shown are out of context for what a teen understands about sex.
<b>Question 5:</b>
Literacy means that an individual has ability and maturity cognitively, emotionally, and practically to be a conscious consumer or provider of social media. The social media literate person is an individual with ability to engage with media and social media with discernment about context, factuality, and appropriateness of content.
