The Literacy Coordinator

You are the literacy coordinator.

When instructed, find any two examples of people using high-quality language and report this back to the rest of the class.

The Learning to Learn Leader

You are the learning to learn leader.

When instructed, you will go round the class and look for signs of, for example, thinking, wondering, helping each other, asking questions, making corrections and learning from mistakes.

The Emotional Literacy leader

You are part of a team noticing emotional literacy.

Think of words and phrases that might describe the emotions you think have helped learning today.

You're noticing emotions rather than students.

The Chair

You are the chair for today.

There might be times in the lesson when we will be discussing as a whole group or small groups. You will be leading the discussions.

You might find it useful to move between four types of sentence: command, statement, question and exclamation.

You will learn how to help turn taking, time keeping, thinking time and helping the group learn skills and knowledge.'

The Greeter

You are leading the welcome to a class visitor.

It helps if you stand up and use any of the following phrases when the visitor enters:

"Good morning/afternoon."

"Welcome to our class."

"How can we help you?"

You're making the lesson important. You're giving status to the visit. It takes about two minutes. You'll create a memory that will last at least the rest of the day.
