

## Additional distribution maps




K1. Sites with remains of Equus




K2. Sites with remains of *E. hemionus* 




K3. Sites with remains of E. asinus




K4. Sites with remains of *E. caballus* 




K5. Selected journeys made by equids (direct line, not reflecting actual route taken)




K6. Sites with complete or nearly complete equid skeletons




K7. Sites with equid remains associated with human burials
