### **Activity 1: Imagine you are Drusus**

Having read Tacitus Annals 1. 16-30, imagine you are Drusus. When you arrive back in Rome, your father will ask you for a summary of what happened in Pannonia.

Reflect on your experience of events there and write a short report in which you detail key people, conversations, actions and outcomes.

## Activity 2: Negotiation role play – soldiers vs commanders

Scene: A tent in neutral ground

**Participants:** Two representatives of the soldiers and two representatives of those commanding

**Instructions:** Using information contained in Tacitus' *Annals* I, Chapters 16-30 and other accounts you have read, negotiate terms which bring the soldiers' mutiny in Pannonia to an end.

As in any negotiation, it is important to understand your own aims and the motivations of your opponents.

Use of time-outs is allowed.

Costumes and props are encouraged.


