2 Xenophon's Anabasis

General

The single most approachable work for both student and teacher at this level is Robin Waterfield's *Xenophon's Retreat: Greece, Persia and the End of the Golden Age.* It's a good read, and full of interesting and relevant information. Also valuable are chapters 6-9 in JK Anderson's *Xenophon*, GL Cawkwell's Introduction in *Xenophon: the Persian Expedition*, translated by Rex Warner (Penguin, 1972), Tim Rood's Introduction in *Xenophon: the Expedition of Cyrus*, translated by Robin Waterfield (Oxford, 2005), Robin Lane Fox's Introduction in his *The Long March: Xenophon and the Ten Thousand* (New Haven, 2004), and 'Xenophon's *Anabasis*' by Hartmut Erbse (chapter 17 in Vivienne Gray's *Oxford Readings in Classical Studies: Xenophon* (Oxford, 2010). In addition, some of the major themes which pervade Xenophon's historical writing are well dealt with by John Marincola in 'Xenophon's *Anabasis* and *Hellenica*' (chapter 5 in Flower's *Cambridge Companion to Xenophon*).
