- 3. Whom do you believe Tacitus is more keen to criticise in *Annals* IV and V, Tiberius or Sejanus?
- 4. "If there is one thing Tacitus hates more than anything else, it is hypocrisy": to what extent do you agree with this statement based on your study of Annals IV and V?
- 5. "An environment of fear and mistrust": how far do you agree that this is an accurate summation of the vision of Rome provided by Tacitus?
- 6. "Hardly a reliable account of the period": To what extent do you believe Tacitus to be a reliable historian?
