

Plato Republic: The allegory of the cave 514a-520a

Plato's *Republic* starts from the question 'What is justice?'. In seeking an answer, Socrates suggests they construct an imaginary 'ideal city-state' which will be perfectly just, and see what justice looks like there.

The allegory of the cave is in a section which describes the ideal education. It is meant to explain the ascent towards knowledge which is possible for the true philosopher.
