

WORKSHEET 3: Determining career adjacent goals



This worksheet is meant to help expand what auxiliary talents and training you have as it lends to other creative professions. For example:

If you are a good photographer, maybe it is a skill that can be monetized to take headshots for fellow actors.

If you are a good editor, maybe it can be a useful skill to help fellow actors edit their acting reels.

If you speak a foreign language, maybe there is room to give lessons for anyone trying to learn the language (industry related or not).

Write down all of the auxiliary talents and training you have. Determine which of those bring you the most joy, are the most lucrative, and have the biggest potential market, then take this smaller list, and turn each skill into a career goal.

Now run each goal through either the G.S.T or SMART Method above to determine which is most achievable and makes the most sense for your current needs.
