Teaching Information

This production is particularly suitable for:

- Drama and theatre students studying verbatim theatre.
- Drama and theatre students studying Alecky Blythe as a contemporary theatre practitioner.

In particular you might like to explore:

- Alecky Blythe's practice and how she shaped the narrative of the play from many hours of interviews with the young people over a 5-year period.
- The rehearsal process, including the use of earpieces, allowing the actors to hear the real people they are playing as they are speaking their lines.
- The way in which we respond to the material as an audience, with the knowledge that the actors are playing real people.



The following notes have been compiled to help guide you through the significant design and performance aspects as you watch the production, or to remind you of them after you have watched it. You may also want to make your own notes and form your own opinions on the effectiveness of these aspects as you explore the production.

Contextual Information:

- The work on what was to become Our Generation began in 2015, the 800th
 anniversary of the Magna Carta. Part of the research took place during the
 COVID pandemic of 2020 and production was staged at a time when COVID
 isolation was still happening.
- The production therefore reflects the reality of the COVID pandemic which began in 2020.



Key design Elements: Set

- The stage configuration is a thrust stage.
- There is a ramp upstage right by which actors enter and exit the stage.
- There is no permanent set items such as tables and chairs are used as and when needed, often fulfilling more than one function/setting. Stacked chairs and tables give a sense that many of the scenes take place in schools.
- The set is black in order to serve a wide range of settings, with characters' costumes and the lighting design creating the colour palette.
- The cyclorama allows projections of time, place, and other graphics throughout the narrative.
- At the beginning of the play, '12 teenagers' is projected onto the cyclorama, explaining "in their own words, interviewed over 5 years". The characters' names are projected onto the cyclorama when we first meet each of them.



Key design Elements: Costume

- Each of the young people have a very specific style of dress which reveals their age, personality, class and community. The costuming also allows the audience to gain an insight into the period in which this play takes place (over five years).
 We see the costumes alter slightly as the characters grow up and we see them in various circumstances.
- lerum begins the play with a grey V-neck jumper over a pale pink shirt, pleated grey knee-length school skirt, with socks pulled up mid-shin. She seems quite young and naïve: she is 12 years old at the start of the play. Her next costume consists of a pink t-shirt with 3 white daisies on the front. She wears a fluffy pink patterned cardigan and dark trousers.
- Annabella wears a navy blazer, light blue shirt with a bow detail at the neck, black skirt, white ankle socks and white canvas trainers. She wears small gold hoop earrings. Later she wears black and pink checked trousers with a gathered waist, and a pink cropped long-sleeved jumper. She has white trainers.
- Luan wears a white shirt, a black blazer and trousers, with white trainers. He
 wears his tie short and wide. Later he wears a red Adidas tracksuit with white
 stripes.
- Robyn starts with a red puffer jacket, blue jumper, black skirt and tights, a white shirt, and a red tie. She later wears a purple and green patterned dress with a purple and black woollen cardigan over the top. She wears black Doc Marten boots.
- Taylor wears a white shirt, black blazer, and a 3-colour striped tie. He has grey trousers. Later he adds a black and red Adidas jacket with a blue Adidas t-shirt.
- Mia's costume consists of a pale turquoise blazer, pale pink shirt, tartan pleated skirt worn short above the knee. She has black knee-high socks and white trainers. Later she wears tight skinny jeans with a pink denim jacket and grey

- heeled sandals. She wears a dusky pink top under her jacket and wears several gold necklaces.
- Emily's private school uniform includes a green tartan pinafore dress over a
 white shirt, with thick tights and black buckled shoes. She wears a burgundy
 quilted jacket over the top of her uniform. Later in the play, Emily wears pale
 denim jeans with white stars, with a pale green t-shirt and pink woollen cardigan.
 She wears white canvas trainers.
- Zac's costume begins with a green blazer worn over a grey zip-up top and white shirt. His trousers are grey and worn with black shoes. His tie is brown, with yellow stripes. He also wears a heavy khaki checked shirt, a red t-shirt, khaki canvas trousers and black shoes.
- Callum wears a light blue shirt, black trousers, and a black blazer. His tie has two colours and is striped. There is a school crest on his blazer breast pocket.
- Ayesha wears a black skirt and dark tights, pink shirt and lilac and lime striped tie. Her jacket is purple and green in a boucle style (often associated with Chanel), indicating her love of designer clothes. She wears heeled lace up black shoes. Later in the play she wears a black velour tracksuit and black hijab.
- Ali wears a black blazer, white shirt, black trousers, and black Vans style shoes.
 He has a yellow zipped top under his blazer, which is highly visible even when he wears his blazer over the top.
- Lucas wears grey trousers, a striped blazer, a grey shirt and a burgundy jumper.
 He wears dark trainers and has green socks. His uniform style is very much
 associated with private schools. He wears a tie, but it is undone and slung
 around his neck. It is so short you could imagine that it is an undone bow tie. Later
 in the play Lucas wears a mustard yellow sports jacket and green jumper with
 apricot trousers and grey canvas shoes.
- Mr Wyn Huws (teacher) wears dark trousers, a grey zip-up cardigan and a red lanyard which helps indicate he is a teacher. This actor multi-roles and therefore needs small items of costume that differentiate the various characters that he plays. As Stuart Robertson (the vicar) he wears a white clerical collar and black shirt with his grey jumper.
- Mrs McAuley wears navy slim fit trousers, a bright blue blouse, and brown loafers. Miss Burrows (played by the same actor) has a mustard blouse with the

- same navy trousers and black shoes. The same actor wears a terracotta headscarf to play Ayesha's mother.
- Kem wears a black and white patterned t-shirt under a black zip-up hoodie. His trousers are black, and he wears black sliders on his feet, with black socks.
- Taylor's mum, and Emily's mum wears a green dress with a green headband with an orange top underneath. The use of a cane helps the audience differentiate between the different parental figures.
- You will notice that in Part Three, when the pandemic is depicted, the clothing of
 the characters becomes looser and more casual. Mia wears a big fluffy cardigan
 over a vest top and tracksuit bottoms. She wears socks but not shoes. Lucas
 wears a light blue short-sleeved shirt and dark blue casual trousers. He too
 wears no shoes. Ayesha changes into a beige velour tracksuit and matching
 hijab. lerum wears a soft pink jumper and grey tracksuit bottoms.
- Notice that other roles, such as teachers whom we only meet once, are played by members of the ensemble with very small adjustments to costume.



Key design Elements: Lighting

- There is a grid of LED lights in the stage floor which is particularly effective when the stage is in black out, or very dimly lit.
- Later in the play, the characters are talking on FaceTime, projected on the cyclorama. The characters are sat on the stage floor in near darkness, but their faces are sometimes lit by the phones that they are holding, as if they are on FaceTime.
- Lighting is used in this production to create specific settings, using wide spotlights, for example, to delineate small rooms and even a car (which can be seen at 01.22.08). At other times a wash is used to light the whole stage, particularly when all or most of the ensemble are together on stage.
- There are 4 flood lights across the back of the set, which you can see clearly at
 01.20.10 both blue and white are used with these lanterns.
- There are thin rods suspended from the lighting rig some horizontal, some vertical.
- There is also a full lighting rig surrounding the stage, from both sides and front of the auditorium. The lights are rigged at different heights, using the circle and gallery levels as well as lights above and at the back of the stage.

Key design Elements: Sound

- Recorded music is extremely important in this production. It gives a sense of time, place, and the personality of the young people whose stories we are watching and hearing. The soundtrack includes:

- There are also recorded sound effects throughout the production including school bells and the sound of children in a playground. There are hospital sounds, such as heart monitors, as we hear about Ayesha's little sister.
- The ensemble also sings, for example the acapella version of *Some Nights* by Fun, which you can hear from 01.18.30. Some of the characters sing solos or play the keyboard as part of their role.

Key Design Elements: Wigs, Hair and Make-Up

- Each character wears costume that demonstrates their personality, class and attitude. The audience will be familiar with all the styles of dress used in the production, and it also creates a shorthand which communicates the personalities of the characters very quickly.
- Hair is always worn naturally as suits the character.



Performance Style

- Alecky Blythe used the material gathered over five years, which was recorded and then reduced during the editing process to form the production that we see here.
- Notice that much of the dialogue is directed out towards the audience. This is common in verbatim theatre: the audience are intended to feel like *they* are the interviewer, and the character(s) are talking to them.
- Verbatim plays also do not aim for flawless delivery that we might expect from scripted plays. Verbatim incorporates verbal tics and non-verbal sounds such as 'um', 'er', signs and hesitations. It therefore becomes a more convincing rendition of how the words were spoken by the original speaker.
- Fluid transitions between the different locations allow the pace of the play to be
 maintained: because Verbatim theatre is so heavily dependent on the audience's
 listening skills, any break in pace can impact engagement between the actor,
 character, and audience. Notice that the segues between different characters'
 speeches are also very rapid. One character often enters at the end of the
 previous speaker's monologue to maintain pace and create contrast in mood
 and personality.
- The actors who multi-role need to be particularly good at recreating and sustaining regional accents. Very few pieces of costume are used to differentiate between the smaller roles and so the accent is something that the audience relies on to grasp who is speaking.

Key Moments

- The exam sequence begins 01.02.20. This is an ideal opportunity to see how movement, set, lighting and projection all integrate, as well as music, to create a visually interesting and atmospheric moment. As exams are a significant part of their school journey, this is a highly effective way of communicating the repetitive and stressful nature of different exams. This moment includes slow motion and a speeding up of movement and sound to convey the feeling of distorted time. It finishes at 01.03.52.
- The ensemble sequence using ring lights, talking about personal appearance is between 01.39.42 01.41.58. Notice the use of video projection on the cyclorama that takes place at the same time.
- Mia's conversation with her college teacher takes place between 01.49.03-01.49.47. This is followed shortly afterwards at 01.51.05 with Mia's conversation with her ex-boyfriend and finishes 01.52.34. Her scene continues at 01.53.08 until 01.54.47, when she reveals that she is pregnant.
- The use of sound to create setting and atmosphere is particularly clear at
 01.59.52 when Cantate Domini is played to create the setting of a school chapel.
- Anabella explains her relationship with her new boyfriend, from 02.15.31, and continues until 02.17.25.
- The disco 02.18.14 which stops abruptly when Mia begins her monologue. This scene finishes at 02.21.01.
- Look closely at 'Part Three' in which the COVID pandemic is discussed. It begins
 with students talking about aspirations and the use of video projection provides a
 different visual focus for the audience, particularly as it is quite a lengthy play. At
 02.28.07, lerum begins speaking and the rest of the characters also speak until
 02.30.45. Watch as the white chalk style drawings appear and disappear on the
 cyclorama.
- The shift to the staging of the 2020 pandemic interviews begins after an interval.
 This starts at 02.31.24 and uses the sound effects of a phone ringing. The

sequence continues until 02.35.15. Look at how the cyclorama, and the shuttered area upstage left, is exploited with projected videos of FaceTime calls. The visible psychological impact of the pandemic is shown through the staging and use of voice in the sequence that begins at 02.38.17 and continues until 02.46.41. Notice how the grid design of the floor heightens the sense of isolation between each character. This is then followed by the stage being in blackout and a return to the use of video projection to continue the pessimistic mood as the characters struggle with lockdown, up until 02.48.35.





Plot Synopsis with Timecodes

Act 1, Scene 1, Part 1: 00:00:12

lerum enters and takes centre stage, 11 other teenagers then join her. They dance to the music. Each teenager tells us a thought. Annabella thinks we will be part of the apocalypse. Luan boasts that his dad is proud of him, and everyone knows his family name. The rest of the teenagers dance in the background. Zac tells us he's been to 6 concerts in 5 days. Ayesha explains that celebrities are part of her life because she always wanted to be one.

lerum moves to the front stage, she tells us that she has a new friendship group now due to the last group getting her into trouble. She doubts herself because of the colour of her skin but tries her best to fit in with Sienna and the new group. There are barriers with her new friendship group such as not being allowed on her phone in the week but she's happy.

Act 1, Scene 1, Part 2: 00:05:28

Mia rushes to the front of the playground, Maggie, Charisse and Heledd join. They chat about upcoming exams and if Mia doesn't revise, she will fail and have no job. Heledd tells everyone that Mia has failed at life, Mia says she fails at everything.

Act 1, Scene 1, Part 3: 00:07:12

It's Luan's Spanish lesson and there's a new Spanish teacher. He's sitting with his classmates discussing their basketball team being on BBC One. Luan goes on to say that he would like to make a career from basketball as he's not doing very well in school. His first step is to do his GCSE's and then head off to Blair Academy in America, his parents aren't too keen on him going.

Taylor follows on from Luan's conversation on basketball. He explains that his dad is proud of him for getting into the twenty three's team. He gives us an insight to his dad when he was younger.

Act 1, Scene 1, Part 4: 00:10:54

Emily is in her dorm with friends, they are discussing head girl and head boy. Emily tells us her dad works in the school as a housemaster hence why she is in a day house called Upton. She gives us the rundown of the sports and how much choice there is for both boys and girls.

Act 1, Scene 1, Part 5: 00:12:36

Ayesha confesses she's been getting a lot of detentions lately, but she's not too bothered as she has designer bags and Kylie Jenner's new lip kit is soon to come out. She's got a thing for celebrities because she would like to be one but also a dancer too. Her dad wants her to be a teacher or a doctor.

Act 1, Scene 1, Part 6: 00:13:25

Lucas is in a dormitory, him and Ben are talking about the new third forms joining the school. They want to make them feel welcome. They discuss the future, maybe Lucas getting a girlfriend, careers in acting and the club.

Act 1, Scene 1, Part 7: 00:15:10

Ali's in his music lesson, he's nervous about Year 11. He explains his reality is to be a criminal lawyer but would love to be famous. He loves his religion; he must pray 5 times a day.

Act 1, Scene 1, Part 8: 00:16:17

In the school canteen, Annabelle is sat with her friends Hannah and Eva. Annabelle is certain that we will be part of the apocalypse. She expresses her concern that she

doesn't go to church and won't make it to heaven if she carries on, she sometimes reads the bible.

Act 1, Scene 1, Part 9: 00:17:29

Zac and Najma are discussing music. Zac has been to 6 concerts in 5 days. Najma goes on to say they are strict with Zac and his piano lessons. They are both involved in music, so they must stay disciplined. Zac is predicted eight A's.

Act 1, Scene 1, Part 10: 00:18:26

It's Callum's PE lesson and the class are being asked to run laps round the pitch.

Callum doesn't like football because he messes it up for the team and they hate him for it. The team bully him for reading books, but he enjoys it. He has developed a strong back bone as he was also bullied in primary school.

Act 1, Scene 1, Part 11: 00:19:42

Robyn is giving some background on her family; they are working class therefore left wing. Her dad works in temp jobs and her mum is a freelance actress. Robyn's mums' side are immigrants and her dads' side are Italian travellers.

Act 1, Scene 1, Part 12: 00:20:58

In the community centre, Mrs McAuley introduces the Bop till You Drop Christmas Show. Annabelle's mum has a front row seat. Annabelle leads the hip hop show, her mum is proud of her as she didn't miss any steps. Annabelle joins her mum after the show.

Act 1, Scene 1, Part 13: 00:23:22

It's Lucas' singing lesson and he's practising a number. Mr Chapman is reassuring him throughout. He can't quite hit the last note.

Act 1, Scene 1, Part 14: 00:24:35

Emily's at home, she is showing us her chickens. She's frustrated, her chickens hate her but love her mum. They follow her mum around and listen to her whereas when she looks after them, they run around and ignore her.

Act 1, Scene 1, Part 15: 00:25:13

In Luan's home, the table is fully laid, complete with a seafood pasta dish. The family are sat at the table discussing dreams. Luan's mum Luljeta knows both the boys are following their father, which is down the sports path. Argon tells Luan he needs to focus more on maths and biology because sport is more natural to him. Both parents question his American basketball dream.

Act 1, Scene 1, Part 16: 00:27:48

Callum is having a conversation with his mum at home. Margaret mentions that Callum worries too much, she needs to reign him in by telling him to put the pencil down and go and play the PlayStation rather than asking him to get off.

Act 1, Scene 1, Part 17: 00:28:24

Mia's at home with her mum, talking about choosing the right path whilst painting their nails. Martina tells Mia she has no GCSE's and left school at an early age. Mia is struggling in school. As a result of this, her dad has been contacted from prison so Mia can have regular contact with him. Martina doesn't want Mia to follow her father's chosen path but it's likely looking that way.

Act 1, Scene 1, Part 18: 00:30:23

Zac is sat at his new revision table at home. Najma tells us that Zac asked for a table to be placed by the window in the living room, so he doesn't feel tempted to lay on his bed and do nothing.

Act 1, Scene 1, Part 19: 00:31:28

Lucas informs us that mocks are coming up. He has prepared revision cards over half term and now needs to learn them.

Act 1, Scene 1, Part 20: 00:31:49

Taylor is sat at home with his parents in front of the TV. George expresses how proud he is of Taylor for doing GCSE Gym with a disability. They discuss Taylor making it on Team GB. Focusing on the TV, they learn that Donald Trump has become president which sparks conversation.

Act 1, Scene 1, Part 21: 00:32:48

In Ali and Ayesha's home, they are discussing soap TV which leads into a discussion on Ramadan and America's latest news. Ali is desperate to head off to America to become famous, he hopes now that Donald Trump is in charge, they don't ban Muslims.

Act 1, Scene 1, Part 22: 00:34:53

Mia is at her home and introduces her boyfriend, Gavin. They both met via Snapchat which she explained was a waste of time. Gavin and Mia discuss GCSE's and whether they're worth having or not.

Act 1, Scene 1, Part 23: 00:37:25

lerum discusses secondary school and the maturity of the students throughout their life at school. She thinks she would've matured by Year 10 but it seems her and her class haven't at all. She doesn't want to live her life being serious.

Act 1, Scene 1, Part 24: 00:38:13

It's the New Year. Sitting around the table, Luan and family are opening his results.

Luljeta reads them out, they're very bad. Luen explains he is targeted high hence why they're bad now, he has a year to bump them up. Leun and Argon argue. Luljeta and Argon discuss how he's going to get into the school in Rochester.

Act 1, Scene 2, Part 1: 00:41:20

In a church on the outskirts of Belfast, the Colonel Bogey March plays. Margaret informs us that Callum is standing in for one of the boys tonight. Callum and Jake join the boys brigade company for the 50th annual display of 81st Belfast BB company. The BB Captain gives a speech and the company follow with God Save The Queen.

Act 1, Scene 2, Part 2: 00:43:35

In the school entrance hall, lerum is overwhelmed as they have moved into a new building. It's a lot bigger and very pretty. She hasn't seen her friends in a week so they're all very happy to see her.

Act 1 Scene 2, Part 3: 00:44:20

In the school classroom, Callum is happy to be back. It's his home away from home. He decides that as much as he wants to be a wrestler, he is not a fighter so he concludes that the school council will be a better option.

Act 1, Part 2, Part 4: 00:45:22

Mia is worried they'll all get searched. In the park, Mia, Kendal and lestyn are discussing whether they'll get searched and if they do, they can't be touched anyway because they're minors. Kendal and lestyn are making a spliff, it's shared amongst the group.

Act 1, Part 2, Part 5: 00:46:54

Lucas and Ben are sat together. Lucas is discussing his new relationship, which he ended quite promptly. Lucas explains that good things must come to an end but it's her birthday this weekend and he bought her a birthday present.

Act 1, Part 2, Part 7: 00:47:54

Mia tells us that Gavin has officially moved into the trailer. She has also been off school due to her father. The relationship between them is broken and she explains she is done with him.

Act 1, Part 2, Part 9: 00:48:28

Ali, Ayesha, and their cousin are discussing New Years resolutions. Ayesha thinks it's pointless making resolutions, it will just be the same as the other years.

Act 1, Part 2, Part 10: 00:49:32

Music is playing, the whole ensemble is together. They are all glued to their phones, talking about how they cannot live without one whether its text messages or Snapchat streaks. Robyn thinks they are stuck in a 'fomo' culture, seeing what everyone else is up to constantly and wanting to be involved.

Act 1, Part 2, Part 11: 00:51:55

lerum is frustrated that she isn't allowed to do what the rest of her class can do, due to her culture. Her mum told her if she has a phone she will be addicted. lerum thinks differently, she is going to move out and save up for a phone.

Act 1, Scene 2, Part 12: 00:52:38

At Emily's home, Jen and Emily have announced that they will be leaving the boarding house early and going back to one of the villages. Emily agrees with Jen that it will be hard for her to leave because of the social side.

Act 1, Scene 2, Part 13: 00:54:00

It's parent's evening, Mr Dawson expresses his concern to Luan's mum about his English, Science and Maths grades. Callum's English teacher is really impressed with his work, and as a result, his mum Margaret is impressed. Annabella's maths teacher is ready to discuss her grades until her mother bursts into tears. Annabella's maths teacher consoles her. Ali's form teacher questions his parents on how much time he spends on his phone. All of Luan's teachers are concerned, they tell Luan's mum this. Luan and Asif are comparing PE grades. Annabella's maths teacher mentions to Alberta that Annabella keeps forgetting her books. Alberta is not impressed; she tells her maths teacher that she will be getting an ear bashing. Luan's mum is sat with his PE teacher who has told her Luan only got a C. Back to Alberta and Annabella, Alberta asks Annabella if she wants to end up in a dead-end job. Annabella fights back and explains she wants to be a soldier. Tasmin, Ayesha and Ali are together. Tasmin is worried Ayesha will end up on Jeremy Kyle. Alberta has had enough of Annabella back chatting her, she has taken her phone off her.

Act 1, Scene 2, Part 14: 00:59:30

Lucas' main worry is the day of the results. Both of his brothers did well, and it was full of celebrations, he doesn't want to be the disappointment. He shares that he has a girlfriend, but his parents are yet to know.

Act 1, Scene 2, Part 15: 01:00:25

It's Mother's Day and Emily is fed up. She is struggling with the amount of workload she has; her mum, Jen, has suggested she stop doing enjoyable things like the other youngsters. Emily fights back to say she couldn't even if she wanted to as they haven't got Wi-Fi. Jen asks if she would like to join them at the allotment in which she declines.

Act 1, Scene 2, Part 17: 01:01:52

Ayesha and Ali are chatting, today is Ali's last day at school and he doesn't understand why he needs to remember so much information, he thinks it's a waste of brain space.

They are both looking forward to Eid.
