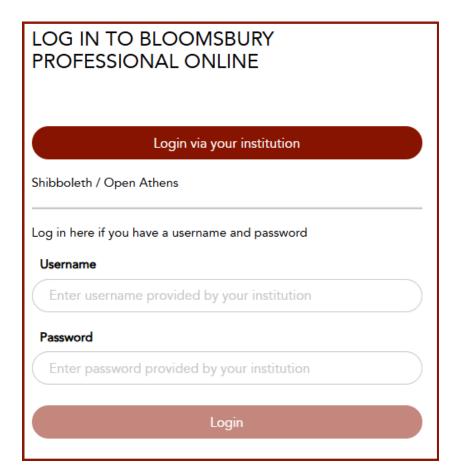
## How/when will I receive my new username and password details?

# What about other access methods? How will they work on the new platform?

IP authentication,
Shibboleth, Open Athens
and http referrer will
continue to work in exactly
the same way as the old
platform.

If you are using a WAYFless URL with your Shibboleth and Open Athens access, this will change following migration and we can provide individual details on request.

Any Bloomsbury Professional Online customers using EZProxy should ensure that they have the Geoplugin stanza in their EZProxy config.txt (if it is not there already) just above the Bloomsbury Professional Online stanza. You will also need to remove the HTTPHeader - request -process X-Requested-With line from your existing Bloomsbury Professional Online stanza.

## Have the URLS/links to specific titles changed since the platform upgrade?

Yes, we conducted an extensive content ID mapping exercise in order to create functional redirects for the vast majority of books at chapter-level, if not at the very least title level.

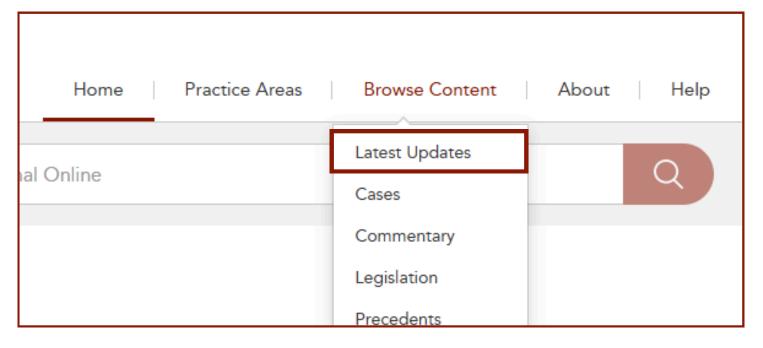
We have had to correct a few links in relation to deep links saved in a library discovery environment, as they also contain suffixes that we generated by the old platform (search parameters or addition filter parameters). Unfortunately, because of the unpredictable nature of these URL suffixes, they were disrupting the redirects at source.

At present, these deep links are now supported and redirect to new content IDs without needing to edit them yourself.

#### **How do I access New and Noteworthy?**

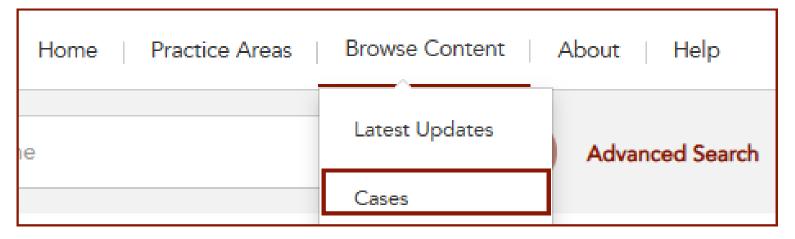
Our New and Noteworthy content is available by clicking the second image on the homepage as showcased below, or by hovering on 'Browse Content' and clicking on Latest Updates.





#### How do I access cases?

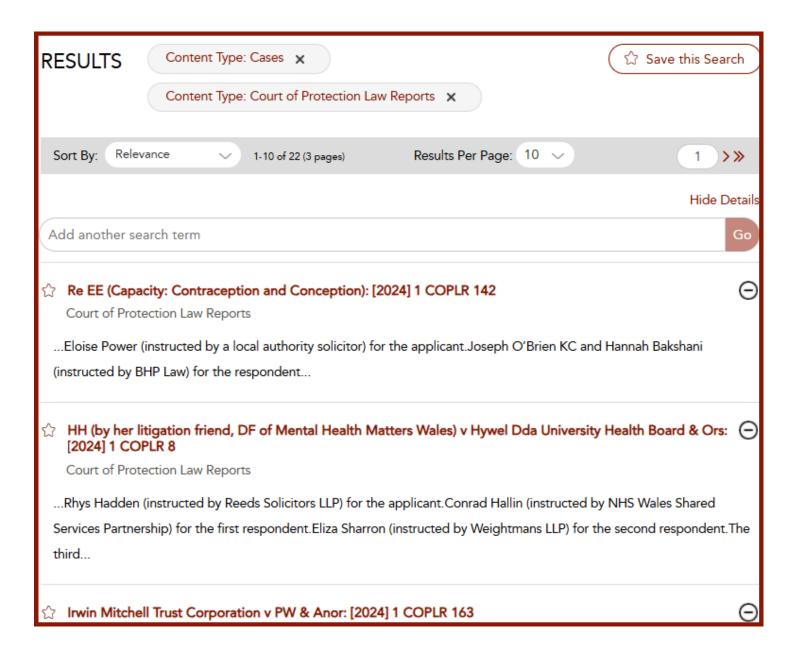
For accessing cases such as Family Court Reports, Court of Protection Law Reports, National Infrastructure Planning Cases, Irish Law Case Summaries, Irish Wills and Probate Cases and Irish Tax Reports, you will find them listed under 'Browse Content' by clicking **Cases**.



By clicking each case that is listed by title or year (*Family Court Reports* and *Law Tax Reports*), you will open a search of the cases.

Here you'll be able to browse the recent cases and click through to access them.

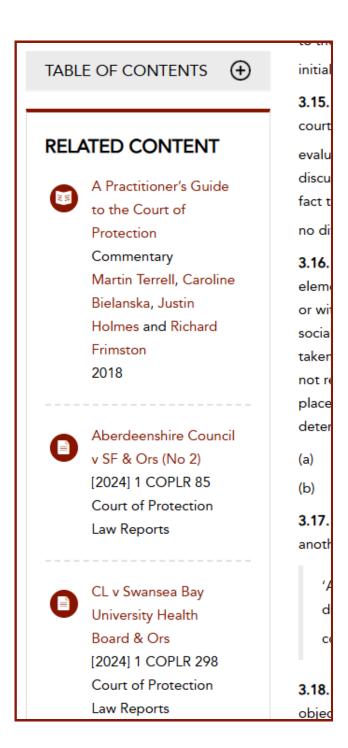

Is the related content based on a customer's own subscription content or does it pull material across the platform within and outwith one's subscription?



As with the filter and search functionality, the titles that show in the Related Content box should only be highlighting titles you have access to.

You should be able to find this on an article page, on the left-hand side, below the 'Subject Box' and the Table of Contents. This is subscription sensitive, and allows an additional jumping off point within the platform.



#### Can the homepage be personalised?

The 'Browse your Content' widget is subscription sensitive so you are seeing the titles you have access to. The titles have been ordered into practice areas dependent on the taxonomy, but you should have access to all the titles within the service you are subscribed to.

You can access your content by <u>service list</u> if you prefer by this page – we will look to add this as a journey from the homepage as well for ease of reference.

The 'Spotlight On' and 'You might be interested' sections of the page (below the 'Browse your Content' block) are relaying the most recent updates as per our New & Noteworthy page. This is not subscription sensitive, and shows our broad content across practice areas and jurisdictions.

We are continually developing the function and layout of the homepage, and welcome feedback regarding subscription sensitive content to ensure this is personalised.



Is it possible to have 'New & Noteworthy' based on customer's own subscription content?

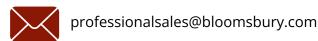
As with the previous platform, we maintained the New & Noteworthy (which also feeds into our 'Spotlight On' and 'You might be interested in' content blocks) as not subscription sensitive.

However, we are now able to support greater specificity of subscription sensitive mechanisms. As we continue to develop our platform, this is something we can look to implement.

You mentioned when you save a search that you will get alerts when new content related to that topic is added. Can you also set up alerts when new editions of books, new loose-leaf release and new case reports are added to the platform?

At the moment, the alert functionality is tied specifically to search. We would need to investigate further whether this can be changes in editions or reports too.

In the meantime, the best place to find the latest updates would be the New & Noteworthy feed.



Is there anywhere that one can get a complete list of the books that one has access to, without clicking into a practice area or service, and without having to click on a plus sign for a drop-down menu?

The information for all titles are under the 'Browse your Content' practice areas for now, as well as the new 'My Services' and 'My Topics' pages which were developed immediately upon launch of our platform.

We appreciate that a list of the books will allow for even quicker reference to jump into materials, and we are in the process of working towards this. We are also considering a static documentation for you to reference, which would include title information, additional bibliographic metadata and, crucially, the service that they belong to.

This isn't something that was previously provided on the previous platform.

### I can't see certain indexes or paragraph numbers in a title - what should I do?

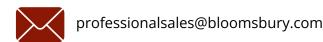
This shouldn't be an issue for titles from our testing we've done pre and post launch.

Several of the titles have gone through a reconversion process to update the XML schema.

If anything has been lost during that process that you notice, please provide the title and a link if possible directly to your Account Manager so we can review to ensure this wasn't an active decision, and correct as a priority.

#### Is there a way of finding the ISBN of a title?

You can infer this from the platform currently, but for ease of reference, this will be included as part of the <u>static documentation</u> that is in development.

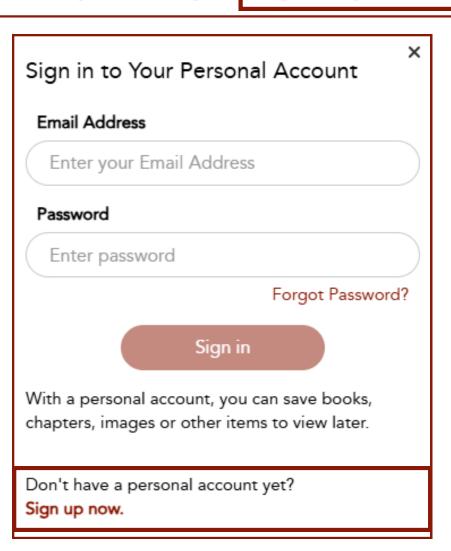


### Please can you demonstrate the personal account?

# Will newer editions of textbooks that are part of your subscription be automatically updated on the platform?

Yes, so just as on the previous platform, anytime a new edition is published online, it will automatically update on Bloomsbury Professional Online.

# Are there any plans to keep old editions of the books we subscribe to the platform somewhere?

We don't keep old editions on the platform currently, but as this could be useful and dependent on the demand, this is something we can consider for future development.

Our other online platforms offers a similar function, wherein they archive old editions but still provide access to the indirectly – maintaining the new edition as the current.

### Can the overall search and search in title be made to work the same?

The function in the overall search versus the search within the title does function differently. While searching with the title, you're likely to use a more targeted search term, which shows the number of hits to access the article/chapter directly, whereas the overall search is more general and will list by relevance.

Highlighting within the chapter-level after searching within title is useful feedback, and something we can look to develop.

# Will you be adding MARC records to the collections we subscribe to so that the books can be discoverable in our LMS?

We have a very well-established library discovery team within our division that manages these records, and this is something we can review to take on board.

## Does the new platform support Boolean operators?

Yes, Boolean operators works within general search and advanced search.

# Do you need to create a personal account for saved searches, etc, even though you can get institutional access?

Yes, you'll need to set up a personal account for saving searches and content, as you're able to see what searches and content are ideal for you specifically, rather than your entire institution.

## Are there any plans to introduce any AI search functionality?

This is a big question for everyone within our market. Bloomsbury itself is adopting a wider kind of AI policy where we're standardising our approaches to researching the possibilities for AI tools on platforms generally. Any decisions made about this on Bloomsbury Professional Online would need to be in line with our wider company approach.
