NARRATOR: Bloomsbury Visual Arts provides tools to aid learners and educators with resources to help strengthen understanding across a range of disciplines. You can find research and teaching tools by selecting the option in the global navigation bar. Here you can find subject guides, bibliographic guides, and lesson plans, as well as recent webinars, external resources, and the Bloomsbury International Encyclopaedia of Surrealism Timeline.

Subject guides offer instructors, students, and librarians a quick way to find material across a range of topics. Each subject guide includes links to resources for deeper study with articles, primary sources, books, chapters, and reference entries exploring a subject. Links can easily be added to syllabi, reading lists, or reference pages.

Bibliographic guides give students and researchers an introductory overview of core readings within a particular topic, written and curated to ensure learners gain foundational knowledge before engaging in deeper research. Links at the left enable learners to find related topics, artistic mediums, people, places, and more.

Faculty members building or refreshing their curriculum can find a selection of specially commissioned resources here. Lesson plans on ranging topics. Offer learning objectives, unit outlines, options for assessment and lesson enhancement, and links for additional reading.
