NARRATOR: Bloomsbury Visual Arts offers researchers, students, and faculty a wealth of reference and scholarly works and makes sure it's easy to search for what you need and save what you find.

If you already know what you're looking for, you can enter key terms in the search bar found at the top of every page of the site. The search engine works with derivative terms, alternate spellings, and Boolean operators.

For example, a search for the term postmodern architecture [KEYS CLICKING] pulls results from all collections in your subscription, as well as those available via open access, images, articles, reference entries, and more. Filters on the left side enable you to only see material accessible in your subscription, as well as open access titles.

You can also use the filters to narrow down results by collection, content type, subject, key figure, time period, place, and more.

When you're logged in, you can use the advanced search option to direct your searching even further.

You can do so by entering keywords with the option of categorising them, [KEYS CLICKING] using multiple terms to expand or narrow the search, [KEYS CLICKING] and selecting one or more content types.

From there, you can use the filters to continue narrowing down results. When you're signed in to your personal account, you can also save any searches you might want to access later. [KEYS CLICKING] Just click the Save this Search Button at the top of the page. Make sure the search has a name.

Click the bell if you'd like to receive email alerts when new resources are added that fit that search, and then hit save. You'll see your search by going up to your account info, opening my content, and clicking the My Saved Searches tab.
