Episode 2 summary

- What we see in porn is often counterfeit: counterfeit relationship, counterfeit intimacy, and counterfeit connection.
- These counterfeits can be destructive in their nature, from eroticizing sexual abuse to intimacy without connection.
- When we really examine the counterfeits, we start to see their cracks and flaws. Porn doesn't require much from us, but it also doesn't grow us or mold us like real relationship, intimacy, and connection.
