### REVIEW LAST WEEK'S NEXT STEPS

### MESSAGE SUMMARY

The first belief that is catalytic to spiritual growth is salvation by grace. This includes the forgiveness of our sin, but it's not just a way of dealing with the problem of guilt. It is that, but it's not just that. It's about life! It's about life right here and now. There are three images that represent what's at the heart of Christianity. The first image is a stain. We are stained in our souls and cannot remove the guilt, the stain, ourselves. Through the cross, through the shed blood of Jesus, our stains are removed. The next image to consider is a computer. Computers have what we call memory - RAM- random access memory. But of course, a computer can remember nothing next to God. God remembers everything we've ever said, done, or thought. But God longs to remove from our record all of the guilt and the wrongdoing. God longs to forgive based on his grace. Will you just say 'yes'? Will you just take from God this gift of forgiveness that He's offering? The third image is that of adoption. We can, not on the basis of our good works, but by God's grace through what Jesus did on the cross, be adopted forever into God's family. Within the doctrine of salvation we are safe and secure, nothing can snatch us from the Father's hand.

# KEY STATEMENT FOR THE WEEK

I believe a person comes into right relationship with God by God's grace through faith in Jesus Christ.

#### DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- 1. Read Mark 1:14-15. How would you explain the "good news" to someone? How was it first explained to you?
- 2. Read John 10:1-18. Jesus, the Good Shepherd, came that His sheep might have life and have it abundantly. We often fail to experience the benefits of this abundant life Jesus came to give us. Why do you think that is? Take time to define as a group what having an abundant life in Christ should look like.
- 3. At the death of their brother Lazarus, Mary and Martha were asked if they believed that Jesus was the "resurrection and the life." Do you believe that, or do you have questions? Share why you believe, or your questions with the group. Remember, we are all on a journey of spiritual growth and this group is a safe place to ask your questions.
- 4. How should the knowledge that Jesus is the resurrection and the life shape our lives here and now?
- 5. It's been said that sin is like spaghetti sauce; it stains everything it touches. Jeremiah 2:22 tells us that we are all stained by sin. Read 1 John 1:5-10 and compare what keeps us "stained" with what allows the stain to be removed.
- 6. God said in Jeremiah 31:34 when He forgives, He remembers our sin no more. If God can forget our past, why do we often have a difficult time forgetting? How does holding on to our past keep us from experiencing the abundant life God intends?
- 7. Make a list of the markers of our adoption from Romans 8:14-17. If you'd like, read this passage for these different Bible translations which can be found in the YouVersion Bible app: NIV, ESV, TPT, CSB

#### PRAYER

Prayer as a spiritual practice is our conversational life with God, where He hears from us and we hear from Him, with the intent of learning and leaning into His will for our lives. Let this prayer guide you over the next week.

God, I acknowledge that I'm a sinner. I have stains, I've got guilt. That's been a burden on me. Sometimes I try to forget it but I know it's there, and I know You know it's there. So I'm going to stop trying to earn my way into your favor by doing good things. I'm not going to depend on a list of good behaviors. I understand now, God, that when Jesus died on the cross he died in my place. He paid my penalty. His blood was shed to cleanse me and he would have done that if I was the only person in the world. And so now, as an act of faith, God, I receive your forgiveness, your mercy. I want to be your child, adopted into your family. I put my life into your hands. I will spend the rest of my life as a follower, as a student of Jesus. Amen
