#### WHY CONDUCT THE KAP?

Benchmark citizen's knowledge about the electoral process

Identify the gaps in planning and track progress of over time

Provide citizen input into elections planning

Provide feedback on EMB performance

To make elections meaningful by tracking apportunities for policy uptake

Political parties validating the KAP tool

50/50 Gender split

Utilised ECSL data – 2018 VRC and polling stations.


Ensured political party validation of tools & ownership

Divided SL 16 districts in to two Stratas:

Competitive district strata: Moyamba, Kono, Kambia, W/Urban, W/Rural, Falaba & Koinadugu


Stronghold district star: Bo, Pujehun, Bonthe, Kenema Kailahun, Bombali, Pork Loko, Karene & Tonkolili








HOW WILL YOU DECIDE WHOM TO VOTE FOR PRESIDENT?









## Will you vote for a presidential candidate that majority of people from your ethnic group do not support?



Will you vote for a presidential candidate that majority of people from your region do not support?




Will you vote for the same political party party you voted in 2018?


#### Citizen's policy priorities Cont.

## Demand for and commitment to reforms


- 1. In the 1st yr. introduce traffic light and reduce police on the street
- 2. Make payment for traffic offences via electronic money
- 3. MPs and presidential aspirants to publish assets on or before nomination
- 4. Political parties to commit to achieving 50% employment for youth
- 5. The next government to evenly distribute appointments to regions. Not below 15% and above 30% per region
- 6. Pay executives of parliamentary parties from the consolidated fund

- 1. Commit to not throwing rubbish on the street and support enforcement of public sanitation laws.
- 2. Commit to stopping to build houses in unauthorized locations and setting fire on bushes
- 3. Stop putting undue pressure on judges, police magistrates, EMBs and allow the law to take its course
- 4. Stop paying bribes to public officials like police, teachers, health workers and tax officials
- 5. Stop begging MPs and politicians for money and personal gifts
- 6. Will never use social media to incite ethnic tension and hate


#### Are you afraid there will be violence in the election




### What do you think is the major cause of political violence during election time?




Do you think the police will provide a secure environment in which all Sierra Leoneans are safe to vote?






#### Do you know how parties will select the MP candidates under PR?




### Where do you get your most reliable information about the election?
