About the Garden

The National Botanic Garden of Wales (NBGW) is a centre of expertise for biodiversity, conservation, education, research, and horticulture. NBGW has become an established national institution since opening in 2000, working with partners throughout Wales and internationally. It is a Botanic Gardens Conservation International (BGCI) accredited institution. Based in Llanarthne, Carmarthenshire, the 568-acre estate features a mixed landscape comprising of formal gardens, a National Nature Reserve (NNR), a certified organic farm all within a Cadw Grade II* parkland. On-site facilities include classrooms, laboratories and the National Seed Bank of Wales. Current science work is focused on pollinators, regenerative practises in grasslands and the Welsh flora.

NBGW is a bilingual institution delivering a wide range of services and public benefits. As a tourism destination, NBGW attracts 160,000 visitors and delivers 27,000 educational contacts. It has a flourishing two-year horticultural apprenticeship programme. It has delivered nationally significant granted funded projects such as 'Growing the Future' and 'Biophilic Wales' which have helped support education, engagement and community horticulture. Partnerships with universities and conservation practitioners foster collaborative research and conservation, collectively advancing the understanding and preservation of Wales' natural heritage. Description of Role

The Apprentice Horticulturist is a training position within the Horticulture Department. It is on a two-year fixed contract. They will rotate through the horticultural sections working alongside the Senior Horticulturists and Horticulturists to gain experience of all aspects of horticulture within a botanic garden setting. This will include propagation and nursery maintenance; maintenance of public glasshouse displays and collections; maintaining a wide range of plant material from trees to herbaceous perennials; working with a variety of horticultural machinery and contributing to the general upkeep of the site. They will get training and experience on using the plant records database provided through the Plant Records Officer.

Throughout the course of the two-year programme they will undertake informal work-based assessments set by the Apprenticeship Coordinator; including plant identification, keeping a work diary and producing job cards. On successful completion of the programme they will achieve the City & Guilds Level 2 Diploma in Work-based Horticulture (QCF). In tandem with this they will complete the RHS Level 2 Certificate in Principles of Horticulture as a day release element. They will undertake coursework and written projects and tasks set as part of the programme in their own time. They will take part in placements at other relevant gardens or institutions of up to four weeks over the course of their tenure.

They will work within the health and safety standards set with the Horticulture Department and wider Garden. They will participate in the weekend duty rota. They will support with any other reasonable duties that relate to the maintenance of the Garden and the living collections. They may be required to work in other NGBW teams from time to time depending on the needs of the organisation. They will support the Horticulture Department with content creation for engagement activities and interpretation. They will participate in garden events, outreach and educational activities as required.



The Apprentice Horticulturist will have a minimum of two GCSEs at grades A*- C, including mathematics and English. They will be a highly motivated individual dedicated to pursuing a career in horticulture. They will be well organised, capable of completing the practical and written elements of the programme and a team player. They will have a commitment to the delivery of NBGWs Mission and Strategic Objectives.
