**Changes to the 2020 Rules since publication (for enforcement in 2020)**

8.3.2	<p><b>Ascertainment.</b> The level of the sixth place prize must first be determined. The increase in value of prizes up to first place is then subject to regular percentage increments which are neither greater than the higher, nor less than the lower, percentages shown at the head of each column in the table. Prizes should be rounded down to the nearest pound.</p> <p>When awarded, prize money is mandatory for the <b>first</b> <del>three</del> placed Competitors. Prizes to Competitors placed <b>below</b> <del>above</del> this must be based at least on one prize per every six starters in the dressage test, excluding HC Competitors. If Organisers choose to award prize money to lower placed Competitors it must be equal to that awarded to the 6th place.</p>
<p>11.5 11.5.1</p> <p>11.5.2</p>	<p>Data Protection</p> <p>Any information provided in connection with membership applications will be used to process membership and will be disclosed to affiliated Event Organisers, their employees and employees of BE, in order to process competition records. This data will also be disclosed to a number of third party organisations in order to provide an online entries system for use by affiliated Event Organisers <b>as well as data analysis</b>. Competition records will be displayed on the BE website and may be displayed on the Event Organiser's website, and any site owned by the provider of an online entries system.</p> <p>Should a Member receive an injury as the direct result of an accident occurring whilst participating in any Event organised by an affiliated Event Organiser, any medical reports relating to the Member's condition will be passed by BE. Any Medical Reports passed to BE will be held on Members' records and passed in confidence to the UK Transport Research Laboratory (TRL) for the purposes of safety analysis.</p>
