

Rules for the British Eventing BE80(T) Team Challenge

Eligibility for the BE80(T) Team Challenge Qualifiers

- Horse and Competitor minimum eligibility requirements as per Rule 2.9.5: BE80(T)
- Combinations must not have competed at BE100 level in the current or preceding season
- Downgraded Horses, if otherwise eligible, may take part
- Teams must consist of at least three combinations and a maximum of four
- Combinations can only compete at one Team Challenge level in the current season but can compete in as many Qualifiers as they wish to
- A combination may be part of more than one team at Qualifiers, in adherence to rule 5.16.
- Riders may compete in more than one team at the same Qualifier as long as they are on a different horse and are otherwise eligible. A rider may ride more than one horse within the same team at the same Qualifier
- Riders may compete at Qualifiers on a Day Pass
- Horses can compete at Qualifiers on a Horse Day Pass
- All teams must register their interest to compete at each Qualifier on the BE website. Only teams officially notified as accepted by British Eventing are permitted to make an entry into a Team Challenge Qualifier
- All team names must be approved by the BE office
- At least three members of each team must have made an entry to the Team Challenge section of the Qualifier by the Ballot Date. Failure to do so will result in the team place being offered to the next team on the waitlist, where applicable
- A maximum of two substitutions per team are permitted prior to Entry Amendment Date, as published on the event schedule for both Team Challenge Qualifiers and the Championship
- For substitutions made after Entries Amendment Date, a fee of £10 (plus VAT if applicable) is payable if the request is accepted
- Results gained at Team Challenge Qualifiers do not count towards qualification for the BE80(T) Championship . (During this pilot phase of the Team Challenge and as a



result of wider eligibility criteria, individual results will not be processed for other Championship eligibility at this stage.)

Eligibility for the BE80(T) Team Challenge Championship

- Combinations must be Full Members with British Eventing at the time of entry for the Championship
- Horses must have a valid season ticket or half season ticket at the time of entry for the Championship
- Both horse and rider must still be eligible to compete BE80(T) classes on the date of the Championship
- Combinations must not have competed at BE100 level in the current or preceding season
- Downgraded Horses, if otherwise eligible, may take part
- Teams must consist of at least three combinations and a maximum of four

Qualification for the BE80(T) Team Challenge Championship

- The winning team from each qualifier will qualify for the Championship. If the winning team has already qualified then the qualification will pass down the line. The number of teams which qualify for the Championship may be adjusted at the request of the Chief Executive
- The three lowest finishing team member scores will count. The team with the lowest collective score will be the winners. If the score of two or more teams is the same, the following factors will be used to determine the result between them;
 - The best collective cross country score of the three lowest scores that is with the fewest aggregate time or jumping penalties.
 - If there is still equality, the average cross country times of the three lowest scores which is closest to the optimum time.
- Only teams who have completed may be eligible to qualify for the Championships
- Combinations, if qualified for the Championship in more than one team, can only compete in one team at the Championship.



Rules for the BE90 Open Team Challenge

Eligibility for the BE90 Open Team Challenge Qualifiers and Championship

- Combinations must not have completed at BE105 or above in the current or preceding season.
- Competitors who have completed a new 3*,4* or 5* or Advanced competition in the current season, or in the two immediately previous seasons are not eligible to take part.
- All Grades of horse are eligible
- Teams must consist of at least three combinations and a maximum of four
- Combinations can only compete at one Team Challenge level in the current season but can compete in as many Qualifiers as they wish to
- A combination may be part of more than one team at Qualifiers, in adherence to rule 5.16.
- Riders may compete in more than one team at the same qualifier as long as they are on a different horse and are otherwise eligible. A rider may ride more than one horse within the same team at the same qualifier.
- Riders may compete at Qualifiers on a Day Pass
- Horses can compete at Qualifiers on a Horse Day Pass
- All teams must register their interest to compete at each Qualifier on the BE website. Only teams officially notified as accepted by British Eventing are permitted to make an entry into a Qualifier.
- All team names must be approved by the BE office
- At least three members of each team must have made an entry to the Qualifier by the Ballot Date. Failure to do so will result in the team place being offered to the next team on the waitlist, where applicable.
- A maximum of two substitutions per team are permitted prior to Entry Amendment Date, as published on the event schedule for both Team Challenge Qualifiers and the Championship.
- For substitutions made after Entries Amendment Date, a fee of £10 (plus VAT if applicable) is payable if the request is accepted



• Results gained at Team Challenge Qualifiers do not count towards qualification towards the Science Supplement Cup. (During this pilot phase of the Team Challenge and as a result of wider eligibility criteria, individual results will not be processed for other Championship eligibility at this stage.)

Eligibility for the BE90 Open Team Challenge Championship

- Combinations must be Full Members with British Eventing at the time of entry for the Championship.
- Horses must have a valid season ticket or half season pass at the time of entry for the Championship
- Competitors who have completed a new 3*,4* or 5* or Advanced competition in the current season, or in the two immediately previous seasons are not eligible to take part.
- Combinations must not have completed at BE105 or above in the current or preceding season.
- All Grades of horse are eligible
- Teams must consist of at least three combinations and a maximum of four

Qualification for the BE90 Open Team Challenge Championship

- The winning team from each qualifier will qualify for the Championship. If the winning team has already qualified then the qualification will pass down the line. The number of teams which qualify for the Championship may be adjusted at the request of the Chief Executive
- The top three lowest finishing team scores will count. The team with the lowest collective score will be the winners. If the score of two or more teams is the same, the following factors will be used to determine the result between them;
 - The best collective cross country score of the three lowest scores that is with the fewest aggregate time or jumping penalties.
 - If there is still equality, the average cross country times of the three lowest scores which is closest to the optimum time.
- Only teams who have completed may be eligible to qualify for the Championships
- Combinations, if qualified for the Championship in more than one team, can only compete in one team at the Championship.
