

BAILEYS JUMP TRAINING

CLASS 1: JT BE80

Starting at 8.30am
Fences will be approx: 0.8m
Placings/Qualification for the JT Final to the top 25%

CLASS 2: JT BE90

Starting after Class 1 but not before 11am
Fences will be approx: 0.9m and there will be a double Placings/Qualification for the JT Final to the top 25%

CLASS 3: JT BE100

Starting after Class 2 but not before 1.30pm
Fences will be approx: 1m and there will be a double Placings/Qualification for the JT Final to the top 25%

Day Pass members are eligible for the discounted members' rate.

Four year old horses may only compete in JT80 classes.

MISCELLANEOUS

Entries will taken on a first come, first served basis. Waitlists will be operational for any oversubscribed classes. Please enter via the BE website. The status of the classes will be shown on the British Eventing website.

All competitors will be scored together and the top 25% from each of the three classes will qualify for the Series Championship in their respective class.

Riders on the top 100 list, riders who are entitled to wear the Union Jack Badge as a result of representing Great Britain at Pony, Junior, Young Rider or Senior level in the last three years and any combination of horse and rider who has previously won one of the championship classes will incur a five point penalty. (please declare this to the secretary on the day, before competing)

BAILEYS JUMP TRAINING

About the competition

British Eventing Baileys Jump Training is open to all riders, whether affiliated to British Eventing or not, and offers a unique opportunity to obtain training, advice and support within a competitive environment.

Aimed at those starting out in eventing as well as those already competing at BE80(T), BE90 and BE100 level; it is judged on STYLE and PERFORMANCE. The aim of the competition is to encourage competitors to improve their technique and, in doing so, improve their results.

The courses are built to the standard of a British Eventing show jumping track and are designed to encourage effective riding.

THE COMPETITION FORMAT

The competition is split into three phases. Each rider will be given a time for the guided warm up (phase 2) and they will proceed to phase 3 directly after the warm up.

Phase 1: The course walk: There will be a guided course walk filmed and available at www.youtube.com/user/BritishEventingGB. Rider course walks will be available throughout the class.

Phase 2: Guided working in: Each rider will receive a guided warm up with an Accredited Coach prior to phase 3. Riders will be warmed up over fences. There will be sufficient time to warm up prior to your coaching on the flat.

Phase 3: The competition : Riders will jump one round, watched by an Accredited Coach, and receive feedback and advice. They will then remain in the arena and jump a second round. Both rounds will be scored and jumping faults deducted. The scores from both rounds will be added together to provide a final score. Comment sheets are available for collection at the end of the competition.

Scoring and Faults: The course will consist of up to 12 jumping efforts and may contain a double.

Positive scores are given as follows for each round.

A: The horse's balance and rhythm. Max 10 marks

B: The horse's paces and quality of the jump.
Max 10 marks

C: The rider's ability to present the horse correctly to the fence and ride accurate lines. Max 10 marks

D: The rider's position, balance and ability to follow the horse's movement over the fence. Max 10 marks

E: Harmony. The partnership between horse and rider.
Max 10 marks

Error of course not rectified	Elimination
Retaking an obstacle	Elimination

First fall of rider	Elimination
First fall of horse	Elimination

THE SERIES CHAMPIONSHIP:

The Series Championship will be held at Solihull Riding Club on 28 February 2021. Combinations who have qualified will be notified in writing and provided with entry details. At the championships there will be a course walk and coaching will be given during warm up and competition rounds, as at the qualifiers. The only difference being that the second round at the Championships will be subject to timing as at a BE horse trial.

Dress: BE Rules 2020 for Show Jumping. i.e. Tweed coat with coloured stock or collar and tie and plain black/brown or topped boots, alternatively navy/black coat with white stock and plain black boots; white, buff or fawn breeches; gloves; hard hat which should comply with BE standard for show jumping with black or dark blue cover. (Any untagged hard hat will require inspection at declaration). Black leather gaiters and matching leather boots are acceptable. Riders under the age of 16 may wear jodhpurs with jodhpur boots and/or plain black or brown half chaps.

- Competitors making postal entries will be contacted if they have been placed on the waiting list.
- This training is given under the auspices of British Eventing and will be overseen by British Eventing Accredited Coaches and Officials, whose decisions will, in all matters, be final.
- The competition timetable may be subject to variation according to entries received, conditions and the facilities available.
- The competition is open to any rider who will be 12 and over in 2020; there is no upper age limit.
- For 80cm classes Horses/ponies must be at least 137cms and be aged 4 years or over in 2020.
- For 90cm classes Horses/ponies must be at least 137cms and be aged 5 years or over in 2020.
- For 100cm classes Horses/ponies must be at least 142cms and be aged 5 years or over in 2020.
- 4 year old horses may only compete in a maximum of 4 classes throughout the 2020/21 Jump Training series.

- There is no limit to the number of horses/ponies a rider may enter (providing there is sufficient space in the class)
- Only qualifying combinations will be eligible for the championships. In exceptional circumstances the British Eventing Jump Training Team reserve the right to alter or amend the number of qualifiers or participants at the final, as they see fit.
- In the event of equal placing, the competitor with the better jumping result will be awarded the higher placing. i.e. where two competitors have an equal final score of 35 and one has a clear round and the other 4 jumping faults, the competitor with the clear round will achieve the higher placing.
- Any objections must be made within 15 minutes of the incident together with a deposit of £10. The decision of the BE Official is final.
- Please print numbers at home. A template is available at www.britisheventing.com/winter-series
- Participants will be expected to uphold the standards of safety, welfare and discipline normally expected at a BE competition. BE Rules and details of how to join British Eventing can be found at www.britisheventing.com.
- As this is a training competition it is open to horses of all grades.
