ZENGER FARM is a working urban farm that models, promotes, and educates about sustainable food systems, environmental stewardship, community development, and access to good food for all.

Cooking & Nutrition Education Volunteers work with a team of staff, volunteers, and community leaders to facilitate workshops and events focused on cooking, nutrition, gardening and other food skills, with a goal of building community and improving equitable access to nutritious foods in East Portland. Activities utilize our Community Kitchen in our Urban Grange facility, with adjacent classroom and gardens, to build community around food and support families to learn and share cooking, gardening and nutrition skills. Volunteers will help extend these opportunities into the community as well, by supporting similar events at Lents International Farmers Market, local schools and community venues.

Bilingual volunteers are especially needed (Spanish, Vietnamese, Chinese, Russian, Nepalese or other language represented in East Portland immigrant communities).

TIME COMMITMENT

- Seasonal commitment of at least 4 months, preferably starting in January, May or September
- Monthly commitment of 2-4 events, adding up to 15-20 hours per month. Events are mainly on Monday or Tuesday evenings, Sundays at the Lents International Farmers Market and occasionally other days and times.
- Time commitment and schedule will be discussed with each applicant to meet the needs of the Volunteer and Zenger Farm

RESPONSIBILITIES

- Work as a team to prepare for and assist with cooking, nutrition and gardening events and workshops
- Lead activities with small groups of children and adults
- Interact with participants and volunteers in an warm and helpful manner
- Connect participants to resources at Zenger Farm and in the broader community
- Maintain clear and open communication with Zenger Farm staff and volunteers

QUALIFICATIONS

- Enjoy working with children and adults
- Positive, can do attitude
- Ability to travel to and within East Portland (personal vehicle is helpful, but not required)
- Current Food Handler's card
- Prior experience in cooking, nutrition, gardening or teaching
- Comfortable working with diverse populations and sensitive to issues of power and privilege
- Bilingual, desired (Spanish, Vietnamese, Chinese, Russian, Nepalese or other language represented in East Portland immigrant communities)
