

TIE BREAKING FORMULA REGULAR SEASON STANDINGS

If two or more clubs are tied in points **after the conclusion of the Regular Season**, the standing of the clubs is determined in the following order:

- 1. Greater number of wins in regulation time (3 point wins)
- 2. Greater number of wins in total (regulation time wins (W) + overtime and shootout wins (OTW))
- 3. Better goal difference (GDF)
- 4. More goals scored (GF)
- 5. More away goals scored (AGF)
- 6. The higher position in the CHL Draw pot allocation

For clarity: In case two teams are still tied after the 5th tie-breaker, the higher position in the CHL Draw pot allocation for the current season will decide about the position in the overall standings.

During the Regular Season, before all games have been played, tied teams (on points) will be ranked in the standings according to the following criteria:

- 1. Higher number of points per game played (P/GP)
- 2. Greater number of wins in regulation time (3 point wins)
- 3. Greater number of wins in total (regulation time wins (W) + overtime and shootout wins (OTW))
- 4. Better goal difference (GDF)
- 5. More goals scored (GF)
- 6. More away goals scored (AGF)
- 7. The higher position in the CHL Draw pot allocation

To calculate the points per game (P/GP) for a team, the total number of points of a team in the standings will be divided by the total number of games played by a team in the standings.

Example: Team A Points: 9 Games: 5

Points per game calculation: 9/5 = 1.8 (P/GP)
