



INFORMED CONSENT FOR “FIND YOUR PLACE” DURING COVID-19 PUBLIC HEALTH CRISIS

Here at Christian Brothers University, we take the well-being of our visitors and our campus community very seriously. This document contains important information about our commitment (yours and the CBU campus community) to resume in-person events considering the COVID-19 public health crisis. Please read this carefully and let us know if you have any questions. When you sign this document, it will be an official agreement between us.

Decision to visit campus in-person

We have agreed to conduct an in-person event for your college decision experience. If there is a resurgence of the pandemic or if other health concerns arise, however, we may be required to cancel the event. If you have concerns about a cancellation, we will talk about it first and try to address any issues. You understand that, if we believe it is necessary, we may determine that we return to a virtual format for everyone’s well-being.

If you decide at any time that you would feel safer staying with, or returning to, a virtual format, we will respect that decision, as long as it is feasible and appropriate.

Risks of Opting for In-Person Events

You understand that by coming to the Christian Brothers University Campus, you are assuming the risk of exposure to the coronavirus (or other public health risk). This risk may increase if you travel by public transportation, cab, or ridesharing service.

Our Responsibility to Minimize Your Exposure

To obtain services in person, you agree to take certain precautions, which will help keep everyone (you, me, our families, staff, and others) safer from exposure, sickness and possible death. If you do not adhere to these safeguards, it may result in our asking you to leave the event. Initial each to indicate that you understand and agree to these actions:

- You will only keep your in-person appointment if you are symptom free. ____
- You will take your temperature before coming to the event. If it is elevated (100 Fahrenheit or more), or if you have other symptoms of the coronavirus, you agree to cancel your appointment. ____
- You will not visit other departments in the campus before or after your visit (unless you are taking your tour with your admissions counselor only). ____
- You will wash your hands or use alcohol-based hand sanitizer when you enter the building. ____
- You will adhere to the safe distancing precautions we have set up in our campus. For example, you won’t move chairs or sit where we have signs asking you not to sit. ____
- You will wear a mask in all areas of the campus (our campus community does, too). ____
- You will keep a distance of 6 feet, and there will be no physical contact (e.g., shaking hands) with your counselor or other staff. ____
- You will try not to touch your face or eyes with your hands. If you do, you will immediately wash or sanitize your hands. ____

- If you are bringing your child, you will make sure that your child follows all of these sanitation and distancing protocols. ____
- If you have a job that exposes you to other people who are infected, you will immediately let your counselor know. ____
- If your commute or other responsibilities or activities put you in close contact with others (beyond your family), you will let your counselor know. ____
- If a resident of your home tests positive for the infection, you will immediately let your counselor know, and we will then make other arrangements. ____
- If you or a member of your visit group is found visiting any part of the CBU campus outside of your Campus visit schedule, you will be asked to leave by our campus safety officers. ____

We may change the above precautions if additional local, state, or federal orders or guidelines are published. If that happens, we will talk about any necessary changes.

My commitment to minimize exposure:

The CBU Admissions Office has taken steps to reduce the risk of spreading the coronavirus within the Campus, and we have posted our efforts on our website. Please let us know if you have questions about these efforts.

If any of our staff test positive for the coronavirus, we will notify you so that you can take appropriate precautions.

Your confidentiality in the case of infection:

If you have tested positive for the coronavirus, we may be required to notify local health authorities that you have been on our campus. If we have to report this, we will provide only the minimum information necessary for their data collection. By signing this form, you are agreeing that we may do so without an additional signed release.
