COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Readings, critical evaluation and analysis of selected topics in current management literature, research and practice. Individual and group analyses and presentations of assigned topics. Major research project to be presented to faculty and senior students.

LEARNING OUTCOMES:

Students in MGMT 490 will exhibit the following learning outcomes:

- Demonstrate understanding of specified content through successful completion of homework, tests and reflection exercises
- Construct an Executable Individual Development Plan
- Learn the benefits of service to leadership through a class planned and executed leadership service project

COURSE FORMAT:

This course is taught in a flipped class environment, where part of your work for the class is done BEFORE attending class through readings, videos, reflection and Canvas. The remainder of the learning will occur in the classroom. A big portion of the course will center on individual student assignments, feedback from classmates, service learning and attendance. Students will be expected to complete all readings and other assignments before coming to the class.

GRADING:

The grading scale in this class is as follows:

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90% - 100% A

Anything 60% or below is an F.
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Your grade will be based upon the following contributions:

1. Class Presence and Participation (150 points)

Class presence and participation points are given to encourage your active class engagement and active discussion. You will be rewarded with a perfect score as long as you come to class and actively contribute to the class discussion.

Presence: Although it is not required, most students send their professor a brief e-mail to explain their absence in advance. Students who repeatedly arrive late to class will have their participation grade lowered. Please sign the attendance sheet when you come to the class. Any false signatures will result in zero participation grades for all parties involved.

Participation: We will devote our class time to role playing, group discussions, experiential activities, and other interactive activities. The instructor's role during many of these activities will be facilitator or moderator. Often during class, I am less concerned with "right" or "wrong" answers than with thoughtful contributions which follow the discussion and either add to the debate or move it in a new direction. If you find it uncomfortable to speak up in class, I encourage you to visit with me about this during our one-on-one session (see below) to work on this skill.

2. Class Assignments (200 points)

You will be asked to complete various activities to prepare for our time together. These activities will vary from week to week, but could include: watching and reporting out about a video, taking a self-assessment, completing an activity, writing a reflection, taking a quiz in Canvas etc. **All assignments are due at midnight the night before class.**

3. Tests (250)

There will be two tests in this class. Each will be true/false, multiple choice and will cover content from the book, class, and any extra readings/videos that are assigned.

4. Executable IDP (200 points)

You will develop an executable IDP based upon the book assigned for the class. There will be class activities and a guest lecture to help you better understand the content and assignments.

5. Service Learning (200 points)

MGMT 490, Seminar in Leadership, is a Community Engagement Learning (CEL) class. This means part of your grade will be based upon participation in one or more service projects. There will be three opportunities to serve in this class:

- FBLA/DECA January 16-17, 2020
- Leadership Scholarship January 18, February 1, and February 22
- Class Service Project TBD

The class service project is designed to teach high school students about leadership. You will plan and execute the event, which will take place on a Saturday in late March or early April.

Your grade for the service learning component of this course will be based upon (1) hours of service; (2) reflection paper(s); and (3) execution of event.
