(July 10, 2021) — In compliance with Section 18004(e) of the CARES Act, Christian Brothers University is pleased to provide the following information to the public. We will update this information every calendar quarter:

 The Department of Education awarded grant P425E201850. In total, the University has received \$1,600,690 from the Department of Education on grant P425E201850.
 - The Department of Education awarded grant P425E201850-20B \$2,339,673. As of the date of this notice the University has not requested funds on grant P425E201850-20B.
 - In total the university has been awarded \$3,940,363.
- 3. The total amount of Emergency Financial Aid Grants distributed to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act as of the date of submission.

 As of the date of this notice \$1,600,690 have been distributed to students.
- 4. The estimated total number of students at the institution eligible to participate in programs under Section 484 in Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965 and thus eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act.
 - The University estimates there are 1,150 students at the institution eligible to participate in programs under Section 484 in Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965 and thus eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act.

- 5. The total number of students who have received an Emergency Financial Aid Grant to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act.

 As of the date of this notice, 2,497 students have received an Emergency Financial Aid Grant to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act.
- 6. The method(s) used by the institution to determine which students receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants and how much they would receive under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act.

The University will use two methods to determine which students receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants and how much they would receive under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act.

The general distribution — All eligible students will receive between \$250 and \$1,260 based on their Expected Family Contribution (EFC) as determined by the FAFSA the student currently has on file. If a student does not have a current FAFSA on file they are not eligible for this general distribution. Grant application distribution, eligible students will receive distributions based solely on need as determined by the CBU grant distribution governance committee.
