Description of Creative Writing

When you read a good poem, do you wonder how the writer managed to form such interesting images? When you read a novel, do you think about how the author created characters you can relate to?

If you pursue a degree in creative writing, you'll try to answer questions like these, analyzing poetry and fiction to learn how writers create successful work. You will also try your hand at creating your own work, which you'll share with professors and classmates. Although it's unlikely that you'll make a living from writing poetry or fiction, you will gain the skills needed to work in fields such as editing, publishing, journalism, and advertising.
