First-Place Finishers

CBU alumna, graduate student and assistant cross country coach **Johanna Wistokat** won the women's division of the full St. Jude Memphis Marathon on Dec. 7, 2024, with a time of 2:54:45.

Johanna earned a bachelor's in business at CBU and is currently pursuing a master's degree in data science. She is one of CBU's most decorated athletes in school history, a two-time All-American who finished the 2022 season as the Gulf South Conference and NCAA South Region champion. She is a native of Wennigsen, Germany.

"Big shoutout to Coach Hoffman for creating such a family-like environment on the XC team and always supporting us on and off the track," said Wistokat of CBU's longtime men's and women's cross country head coach Bill Hoffman.

CBU alumnus, graduate student and track and field team athlete **Berket Mesele** also had an inspired run at the St. Jude Memphis Marathon, finishing as top male half-marathoner with a time of 1:11:14.



A native of Nashville, Tennessee, Berket completed his bachelor's degree in chemical engineering at CBU in May 2024 and is on track to complete his master's in engineering and industrial management this spring.

"CBU has an incredible support group. Without Coach Hoffman and the others, I know I would not have made it as far as I have in this sport," Berket said. "Their support had never diminished regardless of the hills and valleys of my journey."
