Home Care Services for Veterans and Surviving Spouses Pension with Aid and Attendance

What is the aid and attendance pension benefit?

Aid and attendance is a tax-free benefit distributed to eligible honorably discharged veterans or their surviving spouses. It's the highest level of Veterans Administrations Improved Pension Program.

Those approved for benefits will receive a monthly benefit reimbursement for acceptable medical expenses from Veterans Administration. Monthly benefits can provide up to \$1,788.00 per month for a veteran, \$1,149.00 per month for a surviving spouse, and \$2,120.00 per month for a married veteran.

Eligibility requirements include:

- **90 consecutive days of active duty service, at least one day during a period of war. Active combat is not a requirement.**
- **Honorable discharge.**
- **Require the need for assistance with activities of daily living. Assistance includes eating, bathing, dressing, walking and toileting. It's not required to meet all of the assistance needs.**
- **Monthly income and asset requirements.**
