

EDUCATION AND COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT PROGRAM MANAGER

DESCRIPTION

The Education and Community Engagement Program Manager leads and manages a diverse array of educational and community outreach programs within the Department of Education and Community Engagement. This role ensures the delivery of high-quality, in-person programs for students in grades K-12, both locally in the tri-state area and nationally. Additionally, the Program Manager oversees the teaching artist training program and the school-based competitions for emerging artists in grades 6-12. Reporting to the Director of Education and Community Engagement, the Program Manager collaborates closely with the Education and Family Program Manager, and supports the following areas:

SCHOOL AND EDUCATION PROGRAMS

(Programs including the Young Musicians/Ensembles Concerts, Chamber Music Beginnings, Open Rehearsals)

- Cultivate and nurture relationships with schools, serving as the primary point of contact to understand their needs and challenges.
- Manage program recruitment, event registration, and audition applications.
- Prepare and oversee the distribution of educator and family resources.
- Manage in-school teaching artist visits, coaching sessions, and concerts, and process payments.
- Administer the development of materials for the Teaching Artist Training.
- Collaborate with the Education and Family Program Manager to support artist, student, and front-of-house coordination and/or concert production on-site and off-site on department-related event days, as needed.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT PROGRAMS

- Support the execution of partnership agreements with community-based organizations including mentor and coaching sessions, workshops, performances, and related events, and process payments throughout the year.
- Facilitate marketing and promotion-related tasks, including managing school mailing lists and creating print and digital material and e-blast copy, to ensure regular communication about CMS events and opportunities.
- Oversee the Instrument Petting Zoo, including teaching artist coordination.
- Administer department complimentary ticket requests.

GENERAL SUPPORT

- Coordinate artist and guest hospitality for departmental events, as needed.
- Maintain department equipment and instruments (petting zoo instruments and relaxed performance and family program equipment).
- Perform related duties as assigned by the Director of Education and Community Engagement.

REQUIRED FOR THE POSITION

- 3-5 years of relevant working experience with schools and community engagement programs (especially at elementary and middle-school levels) either at education institutions or performing arts organizations.
- Proficiency in Microsoft Office 365.
- Knowledge of classical chamber music repertoire.
- Ability to read music.
- Availability to work extended hours, including early mornings, evenings, and weekends.

DESIRABLE BUT NOT REQUIRED

- Some concert production experience
- Spanish-language proficiency
- Proficiency in Airtable

KEY INTERACTIONS & WORKING CONDITIONS

- The Education and Community Engagement Program Manager reports to the Director of Education and Community Engagement. This position will regularly interact with all members of the Education, Marketing & Communications, Development, Artistic, and Administration teams, and school and community partners.
- The person in this position must be able to remain stationary most of the time, occasionally inside the office to access filing cabinets, office machinery, etc.
- This person will operate a computer and other office productivity machinery, such as two-way radios, phone, fax, postage machines, copy machine, and computer printer.
- This is an in-office position, working from the Lincoln Center campus, with an option for one weekly remote day.

COMPENSATION & BENEFITS

This is a full-time position, with an annual salary of \$63,000.
