The purpose of the processing:

The Camley Street Regeneration Project is a council-led project in Camden Council's 'Community Investment Programme' - a plan to invest over £1billion in new council homes, schools and community spaces.

Our vision (developed with the Camley Street Community Steering Group) is a highly sustainable new Camley Street neighbourhood with around 350 new homes (including genuinely affordable homes) more employment space; jobs, training and skills for local residents; and new public green and open spaces.

We're conducting an online consultation survey via the Commonplace digital engagement platform to collect your ideas. We are also holding in person events in order to meet people, explain what the project is about and collect data using paper copies of this same survey. The data we are collecting will be anonymised and cannot be used to personally identify you.

The information collected from the survey will help us inform the design and social impact of our development and meet our consultation requirements. This allows us to make Camley Street the best it can be.

Most importantly, we can try and make sure our consultation process represents Camden's population as much as possible. This area particularly is home to people from many ethnic and religious backgrounds, disabled people, people at different income levels, and families with children.

People who take part in the survey through our online Commonplace platform can sign up to receive email updates about the project. The email alerts they receive from camleystreet@camden.gov.uk will allow people to 'unsubscribe' at any time if they no longer wish to receive updates.

The legal basis for processing:

Our legal basis for processing is Article 6(1)(e) public task and Article 9(2)(g) Substantial public interest under the General Data Protection Regulation 2018.

The Categories of Personal Data:

Age, postcode and information about your living situation, gender, ethnicity, faith, disabilities and long-term illnesses.

The categories of recipients that the council has or will disclose the data to:

The council will not disclose the data to any other organisations.

Whether the council will transfer their data out of the UK:

We will not transfer your Personal Data outside the UK.

The criteria used to decide the retention period:

Your data will only be used for relevant purposes on this project and will be deleted upon completion (planned for 2027).

Your Data Subject Rights:

You have the right to request a copy of the information we hold about you, the right to ask us to rectify, erase or restrict processing of your data, the right to ask for data portability, the right to object to automated decision making, and if we are relying on consent the right to withdraw consent at any time. There are some exemptions to these rights.
