## Who should I invite?

Anyone who is interested in the future of Winchester! You could host the meeting with your family around the dinner table, with your local community or neighborhood organization, with congregation members after church, or with your coworkers during your lunch hour. There are no age limits.

# How many people should I invite?

Aim for a group of 4-10 people. If you have a larger group, we suggest breaking into smaller groups.

# How long will the meeting take?

You likely need about 30 minutes to 1 hour depending on the group's level of interest and engagement.

# Where should we meet?

Anywhere! Just make sure it is comfortable and convenient. It could be in your living room, a local coffee shop, or someplace you will need to reserve in advance, like a library or community center. You'll want enough seats for all participants, some writing utensils, and perhaps a hard surface to write on.

# What do I do after the meeting?

# Land Use, Housing, and Economic Development in Winchester 2030





Offer new amenities, entertainment, and retail opportunities to residents where strategic, including North Main Street and downtown Winchester.

Encourage contextually-responsive new development. New development will be carefully planned and appropriately scaled, with a focus on creating denser development in some areas.

Promote housing types that allow residents to age within the community. Housing for older residents should maintain connection to Winchester's community gathering spaces (e.g. Jenks Center, Library) and access to everyday amenities and needs (e.g. grocery stores, pharmacies, shuttle to hospital)

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Create and preserve housing that is affordable, especially small-scale development that fits Winchester's character and provides easy access to everyday amenities and needs.

Support and encourage mixed-use development and density in strategically appropriate areas in town, e.g. Downtown and North Main Street .

Provide support for the continued success and growth of existing businesses, as well as finding opportunities to for new businesses in Winchester.

# Connectivity and Mobility in Winchester 2030





Integrate transportation improvements with new development, regulatory changes in land-use, and increases in density.



Make existing parks, playgrounds, and other open space safer and easier to access, particularly by biking, walking, and public transit.



Improve walking and biking safety throughout Winchester for all ages and abilities through ADA compliance and the creation of no-stress bike infrastructure.



Improve public transportation opportunities to encourage more transit use and car share, alleviate parking concerns, and reduce single vehicle occupancy commuters



Create a more robust and safer biking and multi-modal lane network to support the rising micro-mobility trend (i.e. bike share, e-bikes, e-scooters)



Improve walking and biking safety around Winchester's schools, to promote healthy transportation options for youth and to alleviate traffic congestion during peak pick-up and drop-off times.

# Community and Culture in Winchester 2030
