

## **CLEVELAND PUBLIC LIBRARY: OUR FUTURE IS BUILDING**

The Library hosts meetings to update community on the status of its Facilities Master Plan

**OCTOBER 29, 2020 (CLEVELAND, OH)** – Cleveland Public Library is moving to the next chapter of the Facilities Master Plan. Starting next month, we want to share our plans with the community to build, renovate, and redesign our neighborhood branches.

On Thursday, November 5, the Library will kick-off a series of design and construction meetings about the first phase of projects. All sessions will be held online at 4 p.m. The first meeting will focus on the West Park Branch project. Attendees are encouraged to register.

The English Tudor style <u>West Park Branch</u> was built nearly a century ago by Cleveland architecture firm Walker and Weeks. Now, <u>Vocon</u> has been tapped to restore, update, and bring new life to this historic property.
