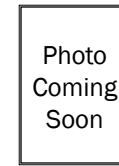

This month's submission is an unusual one but hope that it may find its way in to tickle your inquisitive funny bone. Last summer, I happened to attend the Thresher's Reunion in Denton, NC, not far up the road from north Charlotte. My interest was in seeing some of the old steam engines of the past, but among other oddities, I discovered the following:

In summary, Porsche was in the farm tractor business for a length of time, and tractors like this "Junior" were sold both in Germany and the US with a price tag of about \$1700. It just so happens I was stationed at Rhine-Main Air Base in 1975, adjacent to the tractor building facility in Friedrichshafen, though I had no idea at the time.
