


I am looking forward to attending the Lake Norman Area

Meeting on Thursday, June 25. This will be our first visit to the Lake Norman area and I am excited to meet new members and visit with old ones.







## The Bucket List

I'd always read about Bucket List trips, I never thought I'd do one myself though. Back in February, I was talking to my son, Ben and offhand mentioned the Petersen Museum "Porsche Effect" exhibit was closing and we hadn't been to see it. He'd been interested in it too and on a whim, we chatted about meeting out there for a weekend. He'd fly out of Pensacola and I would depart Charlotte for a long weekend to Los Angeles. I let the idea drop, thinking better of it. Flying to the west coast for barely more than 48 hours to visit a museum didn't seem like the best use of time or money. We continued to bat the idea around and finally said "Lets do it". We'd fly out on Saturday, April 7th, go to the museum on Sunday, visit a few other sites on Monday before catching the red-eye back Monday night. My coworkers thought I was nuts. Trying to explain a trip to Los Angeles to visit an exhibit at car museum, I finally gave up and just shortened it to we were visiting a museum.

The Petersen is a one of a handful of museums around the country dedicated to the automobile. In collaboration with Porsche A.G., Porsche Design of America, the Porsche Club of America, and others, the Petersen gathered significant Porsche road and race cars into a special exhibit celebrating the 70th anniversary of Porsche and the extent of Porsche into our culture. The exhibit contains not only an impressive collection of Porsche vehicles but also memorabilia and other artifacts.

We made our plans, but Ben didn't want to be stuck driving a standard economy rental. Being a savvy techie, he cruised Turo trying to find something interesting. Turo is a person to person rental app, similar to VRBO or AirBNB, only for cars. Looking through the options, we saw everything from GT3's to Hyundai Elantras. Ben was looking for sporty, but I reminded him how much we'd be sitting in traffic. So as much as he wanted to sample the GT3 or the Civic Type R, we'd need something better suited for sitting in Los Angeles traffic.

As the weekend got closer, I noticed the local PCA region was having a cars and coffee style event at the museum on the Sunday we would be visiting the exhibit. So in addition to seeing the collection inside, we'd get the extra bonus of seeing the Porsches gathered outside.

Ben arrived first on Saturday morning. As I arrived, he was waiting to pick me up at LAX in a white Kia Stinger packing a 330hp V6 twin-turbo. We'd read a lot about the new Stinger and thought it would be a good chance to try it out. Our first afternoon was playing tourist, cruising through Beverly Hills and Hollywood. We drove Mulholland Drive, spotted the Hollywood sign, hiked up to the classic LA landmark Griffith Observatory before heading back to the hotel to wrap up day one.

Sunday dawned and we headed over to the Petersen Museum to check out the local region's get-together. As we got closer, we could have turned off navigation and just follow the Porsches. Heading up the parking deck, the entire top level was filled with easily more than 100 of Stuttgart's finest. Ben and I didn't know where to start, 356's over there, a Singer over here, a couple of Ruf's in this corner, a 964 Carrera RS hiding in that corner. As we wandered the field, we were welcomed by several local PCA members. One owner had owned his 912 since new. With over 200,000 miles he'd driven it all over the US and recounted stories of changing the oil and checking the valves in the Badlands of South Dakota. Another owner, of the 964 Ruf, had a long conversation with Ben able wheel offsets and tire widths.

As the PCA event came to a close, we headed inside the museum to begin our tour, passing a Jeff Zwart Pikes Peak Cup Car and a Jagermeister liveried 962. We had made 11:00 AM reservations for the Petersen Vault. The Petersen houses over 400 cars, but not all are on exhibit. When not on display, the cars in their collection are housed under the museum in the Vault. The Vault tour is a guided tour led by a Petersen docent. During our 2 hour tour, we walked through the collection while our docent pointed out the significance of each vehicle. Ben and I were somewhat disappointed by the Vault tour. Being a guided tour, we were at the mercy of our docent's time management. There's so much to cover in the vault that by the time our 2 hours were coming to a close, we had to run through the Post-War era. After our vault tour, we headed back into the museum to visit the 3 levels of exhibits. We were now able to go at our own pace. One exhibit, Winning Numbers, celebrating race cars of all different shapes and sizes. Starting with a 1950's Belly Tank Racer that literally started from a left over WWII aircraft belly tank. Of interest to Ben and I were the Le Man's class winning Ferrari 250GT, a 1967 Ferrari 625/250 Testa Rosa, and the Bruce Meyer owned Kremer K3 infamously campaigned by the Whittington brothers to an overall win at the 1979 20 hour of Le Mans. Continuing through the building, I've always been a Bugatti fan, so I stopped off at a beautiful deep

blue 1939 Bugatti 57C once owned by the Prince of Persia. Each of the 3 floors had something of interest. While Low Riders are not my thing, you've got to be amazed at the intricacies of the paint and interior work.

As we worked our way down to the first level to our reason for the trip in the first place, the Porsche Effect Exhibit, the first car we saw was the 50th Porsche car produced, a 1949 Gmund Coupe, beside it was a 1951 356 SL Gmund Coupe. Showing the range development put into the original 911 design, a Guards Red '65 911 alongside a 959 in the same color. Showing off the years of racing heritage, a 550 spyder, 910, 917 short tail, 962, 911GTLM, RS Spyder and wrapping up with a 919. For an example of recent production cars, a 2016 911 Club Coupe in Club Blau signifying the 60th anniversary of PCA was on display. A black and white list of cars just doesn't do the exhibit justice though. Outside of PCA Parade, one of the best collections of Porsche road and race cars I've seen. Ben and I left the museum having our fill of automotive eye candy.

We were flying out Monday evening on the red-eye, so we had one more day to explore Los Angeles. For starters, we took the Stinger up the Angeles Crest Highway to Mt Wilson, 5700 ft above sea level. Since it was a Monday, we were blessed with very little traffic and were able to exercise the Stinger a bit. 47 miles later we were at sea level, sitting at the beach in Santa Monica. We grabbed a bite of dinner as the sun went down and headed to the airport. As we returned the Kia to its owner, overall I was impressed with the car. Although there were some finishes that weren't up to par with what you would expect in a \$50K car wanting to compete with the like of Audi and BMW. Dropping of at the curb. Ben and I said our goodbyes having a great father-son weekend. It was a lot of air travel for a short visit, but it'll make good memories. Hmm, now about the Simone Foundation Museum in Philadelphia..?











