# **Driver Education:**

My how time flies, and it's time for another installment! Our second DE of the year is right around the corner on September 7-8 at the beautiful (and technical) Carolina Motorsports Park. As I contemplate topics for this article, my mind circles back to an instructor school not so long ago where I mentored our now 2018 Instructor of the Year, Colin Graidage. Colin had been instructing for some time already, and participated in our school to obtain his PCA National status. Mentoring might be too strong a word, for I believe I learned more from Colin than he could have from me. Listening to him discuss the importance of vision in the DE process inspired me to "up my game" in the passenger seat, and his way with words continues every time I speak with him.

Speaking of vision, every sense can provide critical clues to impending success (or doom) in a DE session. Humans are visual creatures, having a wide field vision with the ability to pick details out of a seemingly overwhelming volume of information. But it isn't the only thing on which to focus your attention. Sometimes what we feel, smell, or hear can be just as important. "Is that the smell of (insert substance here....brake pads, oil, brake fluid, antifreeze)?" More often than not if you smell brake pad, it's you.

Not long ago I instructed a student at Summit Point with Potomac Region. She and her husband had been campaigning a mid 90's Honda Accord hatchback in ChampCar (130 HP on a good day), and he had recently decided to step up their skills by acquiring a turbocharged, 700+ HP early 911 tubbed race car on full slicks. Confidence in your car is an entire article of its own, but suffice to say she was intimidated by the car into which she had been thrust (and "thrust" is right word for a 700 HP car). After our third session of the day a question popped into my head as we idled through the paddock. "Do you hear that ticking sound?" I asked her. After getting out and listening to it

I convinced her it hadn't been there before and she called their mechanic. The mechanic promptly said, don't rev over 3000 rpm and bring it to me Monday. It was an end to their weekend on Saturday afternoon, but who knows how much money they just saved. What if the engine had failed going through a high speed sweeper?

Among other senses, if you ride in the right seat long enough you will no doubt feel stability control step in. Modern sports cars are capable of such high G loads and cornering speeds that we no longer recommend instructing with stability control disabled. Porsche cars in particular are so seamless in the application of stability control it is hard for new DE participants to tell when it is doing the saving. I learned old school, with no ABS, traction control, or stability control, and I still feel that provides the best learning environment to car control. I generally open my student introductions with my three rules. 1: You and I go home in one piece. 2: Your car goes home in one piece. 3: We have fun. Developing an accurate "seat of the pants" feel for what the car is doing can help you not violate rules 2, and possibly 1. To that end we have been discussing incorporating skid pad time into the DE program, disabling the nannies and feeling the loss of directional stability in a safe environment. I'd like your feedback on this topic including your thoughts on how best to structure it. Feel free to email me at the DE Chair email. I'm happy to talk about "upping our game" together.

I promised myself to keep this short, and I am prone to rambling, so on to the upcoming DE. 


