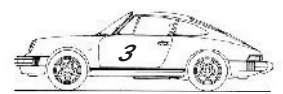

Igniting the Spark... One Person at a Time

The love of a Father-Son relationship is truly unique. Having three adult sons and a daughter, Marc's words mean. We share the car passion and I've spent hours upon hours on the side, a very enjoyable experience. I'm so proud of my sons, and I know the legacy that remains!

We all have "that spark" that ignited our Porsche passion...and we have "Our Story". I hope you enjoy Marc's story of who set it all to life for him.

Jerry Widner's column in the June Issue of Tobacco Roads invited members to write about what ignited their passion for Porsches. I read that issue a few days before Father's Day, which is fitting since my dad, Dale Hewitt, was the spark for me.

I grew up in the 1970s and 80s. He and my mom, Jane Hewitt, would eventually both become longtime PCA members, but were just young, working-class parents back then. One of our first family cars I remember as a kid was a Chevy Vega with wood paneling, which no one would ever, ever confuse for a Porsche. Even though Dad was a car guy my whole life, he worked for the natural gas utility company. So even as his career advanced, he was content to drive super-boring company cars (the burgundy mid-80's Chevy Citation hatchback was a particular sore point). But I remember his stories about seeing a professor's foreign car that looked like a bathtub at Western Carolina University in the 1960s, which he later discovered was a Porsche 356. He was into Porsches from then on, and even though he wouldn't have his own sports car for years to come, he had the singular good taste to buy my big brother and the matching red VW Golf GTIs as our first cars. I'm pretty sure they were built in Pennsylvania, but they were German sports cars as far as we were concerned.

It wasn't until Dad had become an executive and was approaching early retirement that he finally pulled the trigger and

Vier Generationen

This is the first installment of the Presidents Project Page while this isn't necessarily a "project", I find it a fitting way to start off by honoring and showcasing our Members and their cars...hope you enjoy!

2021 marks more than just the end of 2020...it is the 25th Anniversary of the much beloved Porsche Boxster. If you've never driven one, you are missing out on a special experience. With four primary engine designs and a variety of transmission choices, either manual or automatic, you can choose from a manual gearbox or letting the PDK (or Tiptronic for pre-C6 models) switch them. As a pure joy, Lotus Festival! Put the top down and feel the wind running through the cabin taking in all of the glorious sounds of the Flat 6 Symphony...alms or no alms. I do believe the word INTRODUCING has been used by Ann and I while on numerous 8+ hour drives through the Carolina country side in her 98A Boxster. You can find all the historical details and data on Porsches in multiple places and for you choose to be so. I want to get straight to the point on the engine, styling and how we "feel" when behind the wheel. When I looked four of our Carolina Region Members to meet up on a Saturday afternoon for a "shoot-out", some style I believe the answer was unanimous... "introducing" has nothing to get out of my mind!

Dear Steve is General Manager of Porsche Southpoint (located in Durham) and his staff were very receptive to clearing out the front of the dealership despite a "busy sales" Saturday afternoon. The vier Generationen is based around "the car that saved Porsche" would choose to be a worthy cause. Four Silver Boxster 5's with Black Interiors...all "now your own best" manual gearboxes (saved simply to blast in the wheel at the "shoot-out"). You can see the transitional design cues that radiate across all four generations...all a truly stunning to look at.

The subtle differences between the 1989 and 1987 follow typical Porsche fashion – evolution over revolution. The complete redesign from the 98T to 98L models saw the reduction in weight, increase in power, longer and wider air while improving on an already "perfect" platform. We again see the subtle changes from the 98L to the recent version on 98C (also now named T4S Boxster in honor of the flat 4 mascot from the 50's).

Greetings friends and soon to be friends of the Carolinas Region HPDE program!

Well, 2022 has been underway for almost a month as I write, and I'm really excited about the events we have scheduled for this year. I must apologize for not holding the mid-winter seminar in January as is customary, but things both track and personal aligned to move that out. As a way to make up for that, we are holding it during the weekend of the first DE of the season on March 12th-13th at Carolina Motorsports Park. Doing it on Sunday the 13th will allow participants in the seminar to see some of the hot track sessions from the paddock, talk to other participants from the DE, and possibly sit in on a classroom session. Following the presentation we'll be heading out for some parade speed laps (60mph limit, no helmets) over lunch. Attending the seminar will entitle you to a \$50 discount on your first event if attended in 2022, and we run beginner groups at all three HPDE events. Information on this event can be found on ClubRegistration at <https://clubregistration.net/events/signUp.cfm/event/12104>

If you're like I am, you're in the middle of going through your car for the event. In my case I have a dedicated track car, if you want to call it that. Those who have seen the car understand, and once you see it you will too! Part of this is changing the oil, flushing brake fluid, checking pads, checking tires, looking over suspension bolts & bushings, and a general overview to see if something looks out of place. If you drive a street car and feel you have no mechanical abilities, this is the perfect time to grab a shop manual for your car (or a friend who can serve as a shop manual) and start learning your car. I love to learn new things, and it can be highly satisfying to look at or listen to something and realize you know what it "should" look or sound like. This alone could save a weekend or a lot of money in failed equipment at an event.

One easy place to start is tires.....what is the recommended pressure setting for your car? Do you run air or nitrogen in them? How should they be wearing under cornering load, and what does the wear pattern look like? You can often tell mis-alignment just from the wear pattern on the tread surface, and knowing where to look for wear can tell you if they are under or over inflated. Another place is general vehicle sound.....drive around slowly with the windows down and listen to what it normally sounds like. As you progress through a weekend, perform the same exercise between run groups and compare current sounds to your pre-event baseline. Any new ticking you hear? Any out of place squeaks or squeals? You don't have to be a certified mechanic to develop these skills and keep a running baseline of car sounds, and catching something early can save big money on a repair.

Speaking of events, our calendar is March 12-13 at CMP, September 10-

11 at CMP, and November 18-20 at VIR. If all aligns with PCA Club Racing we'll have a solo only DE in conjunction with that in late October. That one is still in the planning stages but right now looks like we'll have room for a qualified solo group using Black run group rules. If you're one of our regulars you may have noticed a significant delta in event costs! While I lament them, I am very pleased that both Carolina Motorsports Park and Virginia International Raceway are involved in capital improvement programs. CMP has an excellent track layout, and while located south of the traditional Carolinas Region territory, it's still within easy day drive distance of the Charlotte area. Its technical layout has different challenges than VIR, and with the 2020 repaving it is welcoming back some higher profile events this year. With the installation of a new sound system you can actually understand people over, new gas pumps in center paddock, and lighting on the cart track/skid pad area, they are raising the quality of our events there. I look forward to the additional features they have plans to add in the coming years!

As always, I appreciate your time and look forward to seeing you at the track!

Carolinas Region Member Survey – by YOU (the members)

Last fall, I formed a Special Committee to develop a Member Survey. The committee was headed up by Vice President Jim Hess and developed a series of questions for your feedback. In December 2021, I provided you with the survey link asking you to participate. Duration was originally set at 10 days, however, I extended it for a total of 15. We received a total of 429 responses (12% of total membership). Over the next few pages, you will see a breakdown of the results.

A survey isn't always about "what can we do better." it is also an opportunity to determine "what are we doing well". Fortunately for all of us, we had a great number of compliments throughout the survey – on behalf of the Board of Directors – THANK YOU for those nice words.

Below you will see a "Report on the 2021 Carolinas Member Survey" put together by Jim Hess and myself.

INTRODUCTION:

The express purpose of the survey was to:

- Communicate that the Carolinas Region "Board" was extremely interested in member's thoughts, opinions, and ideas for future planning purposes,
- Discover and manage member's perception of the efficacy of the club's management,
- Identify and affect improvements in the club's overall performance.

The survey consisted of fifteen (15) questions around member's attitude toward activities & communications as well as their age, Porsche ownership and club tenure. Members were also asked to submit comments and suggestions in an open forum. A total of 429 (19% of Primary Membership) or (12% of Total Membership) members responded. The results of the survey are summarized as follows:

Respondents:

- 16% were under 50 years of age, 23% in their 50's. (39% under the age of 60) 33% between 61 years old and 70, 28% over 70 years of age. (61% over the age of 60)
- 52% have owned a Porsche 10 years or less, 15% between 11 and 15 years, 16% over 30 years.
- 66% owned one Porsche, 22% owned two Porsches, 12% owned three or more.
- 48% have been in the Carolinas Region 5 years or less.
- 78% would volunteer to help with a major club event such as Treffen (*right*).

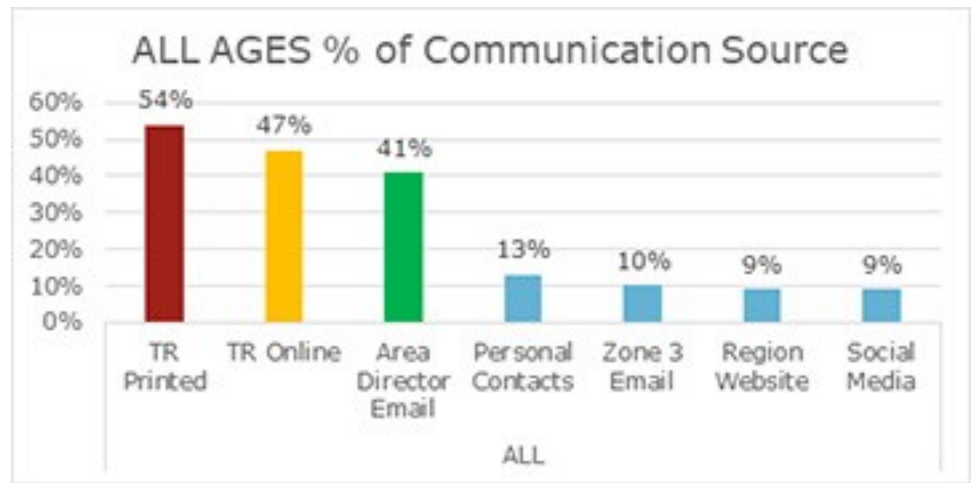
Responses:

- On a scale of 1 to 10 (10 being highest), 83% of respondents scored the club 6 or better on "Meeting their Expectations". 17% scored the club 5 or less. Of those that provided a written response, good communications and providing plenty of social contact (mainly meetings and drives) were the predominant positives. Negatives were lack of friendliness, too far to travel for meetings, and wanting more Tech Sessions.

• Tobacco Roads (printed 54% / online 47%) and the Area Director emails at 41% were the primary sources for information about the club and its activities. Our Social Media channels (Facebook, Instagram & Region Website) pulled up the rear with 9%. (see graph, right)



• Over the last 12 months, 66% of respondents attended 3 club meetings or less, 18% attended between 4 and 6 meetings and 16% attended more than 6 meetings. The top reasons for not attending were Date/Time, Health Concerns, Meeting Location. Not feeling “welcome” was also listed as a reason for non-attendance.

• When asked to rate interest in the Regions activities on a scale of 1 (lowest) to 5 (highest) the highest ranked answers were: Driving Tour with a Meal- 41% High Interest; Tech Sessions/Shop Visits- 38% High Interest; Drivers Education- 33% High Interest; Social Mixers/Parties- 26% High Interest; Concours/People’s Choice- 26% Some Interest; Fun/Gimmick Rally- 24% Some Interest; Multi-Day Driving Tours- 23% Some Interest; Club Race- 34% NO Interest and Autocross- 26% NO Interest.

• By a very large margin (4 to 1) respondents did not want the club to offer other types of activities. Those that offered new activities included having a swap meet, an off-road event, TSD rally, and a quarterly poker party.

• 93% of respondents said that ClubRegistration.Net was user friendly and easy to navigate. Of the 7% that responded “No”, most preferred using MotorSports.Reg or some other app, or had not even used the app.

• The final question in the survey was to solicit comments and suggestions for the Carolinas Region Board to consider. Respondents were generally appreciative of the board's efforts at managing the club with some of the comments being:

- "Great organization! Keep up the good work!!"
- "Enjoy the events and meeting new friends"
- "Great Club you are doing fine!"
- "Have thoroughly enjoyed the Hickory Area group"
- "I would like to acknowledge all the effort and work put in by the board members and area directors in putting on and keeping up with so many events and functions. I know it can be a huge undertaking that is often rarely appreciated or recognized, but often scrutinized. Great job to all involved!!"
- "Jerry Kilcrease does an amazing job! I go when I can."
- "Great job, Jeff Price!!!"
- "You're doing a great job. I think people are getting great value. Don't be tough on yourself."

• Additionally, there were recommendations for improvement as well:

- "don't charge DE instructors to participate in DE events"
- "Change meeting times, dates and places to accommodate those that work"
- "Get more young people involved"
- "Change the way show and shines are judged"
- "Regulations are becoming a problem"
- "Think of ways to make our new members feel more welcomed"
- "For goodness sakes folks need to learn what moderation (alcohol) means"
- "Tobacco Roads, Website, Social Media needs some refreshing/upgrading"
- "Update the website. Try to engage more young people."
- "Just want to know why DE is like some private club that new folks are not allowed to enter"
- "Impose term limits. Need new blood in management"
- "I think you need to offer more event choices. All I have noticed is cars and cappuccino meetings"

CLOSING:

Electronic surveying has become a valuable tool in determining ideas, perceptions, and opinions of a selected audience and/or market. Surveying also shows members that management is keenly interested in communicating with them.

Over the coming months, the Carolinas Region Board of Directors will be studying, ALL responses and recommendations for improvements. We will act accordingly, and I will communicate with you on our additional findings and measures taken to improve your experience.

While the survey identified areas to improve upon, please know that we are very thankful for your willingness to communicate these to us. The benchmark for success was an expectation of about a 5% response rate. Our response rate was 12% of Total Membership – huge success indeed.

The Carolinas Region Board of Directors are highly encouraged to do a follow-up survey, over the coming months. Please be on the lookout for that announcement, we will be highlighting more pinpointed questions/areas for continued improvement.

As I continue to provide the opportunity to showcase members across the Region, here in the President's Project Page...be ready with YOUR story, YOUR project, YOUR passion. I look forward to travelling around our Carolinas Region to find it. We will put it here!

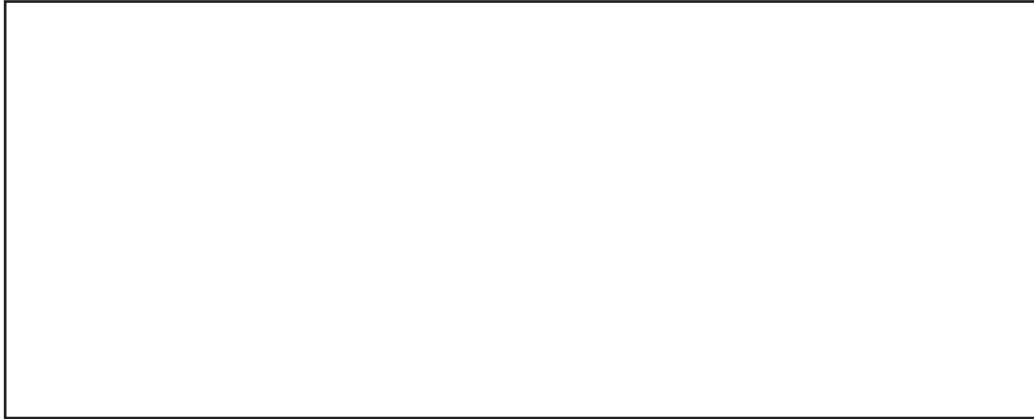
