

Porsche Club Racing is back in the Carolinas Region! After a 10-year hiatus, the Carolinas Challenge PCA Club Race was back with a vengeance at Carolina Motorsports Park (CMP) October 21-23. More than 60 racers and High-Performance Drivers Education participants demonstrated why this event has long been on driver's schedules each year. The weather was perfect, the track was in pristine condition, the drivers were aggressive but safe, and the people—Carolinas Region member volunteers, Carolinas Region Area members who joined us, Carolinas Region Board members and staff, and the drivers, teams, and friends from all over the United States—proved why PCA is "all about the people." The weekend started with a test-and-tune Thursday hosted by CMP. This is an open track day so that racers may practice on a track they have not seen in 10 years and fine tune their cars and driving skills to be as fast and safe as possible. A number of racers said the track was awesome and the 70-degree weather was an important reason for attending.

Friday started the formal PCA racing under sunny and clear skies and 72 degrees. The event was sponsored by Carl Tallardy, a longtime friend of the Carolinas Challenge and PCA racer, CNT Foundations (Travis Bedson, CEO and PCA racer), Martin Brothers Construction (Jimmy Martin, President and PCA racer), and Autometrics Motorsports (Gordon Friedman, President and Cory Friedman, racer). National PCA Racing sponsor, Frisby Tires, was present to provide trackside tire support to racers. The National PCA Club Racing staff who directed the weekend's activities were Vicki Earnshaw (Chief Race Steward) David Anderson (Timing and Scoring), and Joel Nannis and Colin Graidage (Technical Scrutineers). Finally, the CMP track management team led by Ed Corey made the event safe, clean, and enjoyable.

Friday's activities started with morning practice (two 30-minute sessions) for each of three race groups (Group 1 were stock and spec race cars; Group 2 were Porsche GT Cup cars, prototypes, and higher displacement cars; Vintage Group were air cooled Porsches of various displacements produced before 1998), followed by afternoon sprint race qualification and fun races (that included practice race starts for the club racing rookies). Friday concluded with a fun-filled social hour presented by Nadine and Bob Saville of NaroEscape Motorsports, who provide trackside support all weekend (and Bob raced in group 1 all weekend too!).

Saturday was race day! The day started with 15-minute warm-ups for each race group followed by the first of two (2) 40-minute sprint races. Each race group was sent out with a pace car to line up two-by-two for the race start. In addition to the great sponsors, we had for the entire event, McDaniel's Porsche also came out Saturday with a beautiful 2022 Porsche Cayman 718 GTS 4.0 on full display in the paddock. Throughout the day, participants in the High-Performance Driver Education sessions enjoyed the fast track, great weather, and abundant time on track (nearly 5 hours over Saturday and Sunday).

In Race #1, Group 1 pole sitter Ed Dunne in his Porsche 968 (SP3 class) mount led the nine classes to green and jumped to an early lead with Ryan Magrab in hot pursuit. The 18-lap race saw lead changes in many of the nine classes and some particularly exciting racing coming from the Spec Caymans of Bob Saville, Keith Clark, and Jeff Scott, as well as Connor Hare in his Spec 996. At the end of the 18-lap race, Magrab won by a little over seven seconds with Dunne second and Connor Hare, third.

In Race #1, Group 2 polesitter Cory Friedman in his 2019 Porsche 991 Cup MR led the seven GT class cars to green and immediately jumped to the lead never to look back leading from start to finish. Will Tally (GTC7), former Penn State and Miami Dolphins standout Jared Odrick (GTC7), Chris Day (GTC7), and Carolinas Region member TJ Larsen (GTC6) fought hard to stay with Friedman, but his pace was just too much. In the end it was Friedman, followed by Odrick and Tally, both about 50 seconds behind.

In Race #1, Vintage group polesitter Fred Benedict (VGTO) led the five classes of air-cooled cars to the green flag and was hotly pursued by Jarrad Jacobs (VO). Benedict and Jacobs were followed by a fierce battle between Justin Jacobs (VGTO), and Paul Amico (VO). In the end, Jarrad Jacobs won by less than one second over Benedict, followed by Amico some 35 seconds behind.

In Race #2, Group 1 pole sitter Ryan Magrab in his Porsche 996 (Spec 996) led the nine classes to green and jumped to a slim early lead with Ed Dunne in hot pursuit. The 18-lap race saw some scary action midway through as Tim Nagy (Spec Boxster) broke a wheel and spun through the kink at over 100 mph. He and his car were quickly recovered from the track with minimal interruption to the race. At the end, Ryan Magrab won by a thin 2.7 second margin of victory with Ed Dunne second and Carolinas Region member Bob Saville (Spec Cayman) third.

In Race #2, Group 2 polesitter Cory Friedman in his 2019 Porsche 991 Cup MR led the seven GT class cars to green and again immediately jumped to the lead never to look back leading from start to finish. Tally, Odrick, Day, and Larsen fought hard to stay with Friedman, but his pace was just too much. In the end it was Friedman followed by Tally (12 seconds back), and Odrick (37 seconds back) on the podium.

In Race #2, Vintage group polesitter Paul Amico led three classes of air-cooled cars to the green flag. At the start Amico and Jarrod Jacobs sped away from the field and had a great two car battle. Carolinas Region's Wayne Capwell fought with the other cars and maintained third place throughout the race. In the end, Jacobs won by a slim half-second over Amico, followed by Capwell who was 1:42 behind the leaders.

Once the excitement of the day's racing had ended, drivers and invited guests were treated to a southern barbeque dinner with all the fixins', including fried chicken, pulled pork, fried catfish, collard greens, green beans, macaroni and cheese, and peach cobbler. The catering was done by PaBoys of Camden, SC. There were adult beverages served and live music from the Black Bottom Biscuits, a local southern rock band that the Carolinas Region loves. We also were joined by Rosalyn Smith-Stover, Executive Director of the Family Resource Center (FRC) of Kershaw and Lee counties whom we selected as our charity for the event. The FRC's mission is to eradicate child abuse, sexual violence, and teen pregnancy in Kershaw and Lee County communities through awareness, education, and advocacy. The drivers, teams, and friends of the Carolinas Region presented FRC with more than \$850 in donations!

Finally, the night was punctuated with awards for racers, including awards made by the National PCA race steward for the Corner Workers Choice award for each race and the Best Prepared Car award, as well as the Carolinas Region club race chair's award known as the "Hard Luck" award. This year's recipient of the Hard Luck award was Tim Nagy from Alabama who broke a muffler in Race #1 and had a wheel explode in race #2 sending him spinning down the very fast back straight through the "kink". He was presented with a retired (and broken) #4 brake marker from the back straight signed by each corner worker at the track. The Saturday night driver's celebration was filled with racing stories, laughter, and fellowship. We were graced with the presence of racers from all over the United States, including many drivers from the Chicago area who came with Eurosport Motorsports (Brian Weathered, owner and racer).



The weather for this event was great – cool to start and 61F and warmed up to the 70s. I love the fall weather in the Carolinas.

The timing equipment continues to work perfectly so, I think, we are out of the woods now and can quit worrying about the timing system. First car out was around 10AM and we finished up by 3:30PM. Everyone got in 10 runs that wanted to. 4 runs for each group in morning and 6 for afternoon.

The course layout was very tricky with a switch back on the front half making it more technical combined with some fast slaloms on the back half. The course was about ³/₄ mile long. Run times ranged from FTD 54 Secs – up to 70 seconds depending on car and drivers' skill.

We had 6 novice drivers' sign up this time.

I apologize to the new AX drivers that showed up only to be faced with the hardest AX layout this year. Nearly everyone had a DNF on first runs, even the experienced drivers. We held the morning runs to 4 after noticing everyone having problems. We had another drivers' meeting and another drive through to help drivers get settled down. The afternoon runs were much better. Instead of DNFs we had folks hitting cones as they ramped up their game for a better time.

Registration and attendance was about the same as the rest of the year with 32 drivers showing up.


