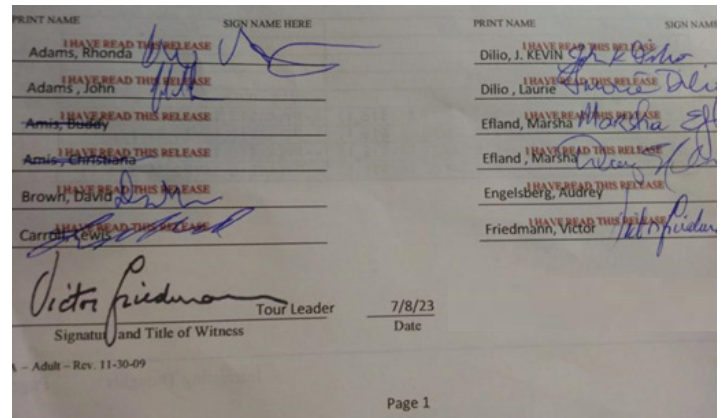
Red Oak staff set aside VIP parking for our group and met us as we drove in. Beer, food and lively company made for an enjoyable ending to a successful drive.

Waivers: we now combine a spreadsheet of attendees from Clubregistration.net provided by Charles Massler (thank you, Charles) with software that combines the attendees listed in alphabetical order with a color image of the PCA waiver. The system then prints in color the waivers with the pre-filled names for members to sign. While some members sign the waiver online, this approach ensures that every attendee does sign the waiver and also highlights no-shows where there is no signature as was the case with the scratched out

names in the example below.

We provided everyone with PDF and GPX files well in advance of the tour. PDF files could be printed or carried on a smart phone. We encourage members to take advantage of several apps that allow importing GPX files on a smart phone. The apps provide turn by turn voice directions. We also have two Garmin units with voice direction loaded with the drives that are available for all tours. In addition we provide two-way radios for group leaders and sweeps.

President's Project Page

It's Always Something

When you consider buying a classic car, even one as well-made and reliable as a Porsche, you can bet there will be a few things to go wrong and a few extra hoops to jump through. Rosanne Roseannadanna (Gilda Radner) told us as much nearly every week on *Saturday Night Live* in the late 1970s.

My uncle lived in a Chicago suburb. He bought a 1988 911 Carrera from its original owner in 2000 and treated it like one of his children. The original owner lived in Pennsylvania but bought it new from a dealer in New Jersey. My uncle bought it through a classic car dealer, and had it delivered to the Chicago area.

I always loved that car from the time my uncle bought it, even though I had actually never seen it myself. Just the photos were tantalizing. Its most attractive feature was its paint color, Cassis Red Metallic. That's a rare color that only showed up on G-Series 911s in '87 and '88. I wouldn't call it red at all, but I would absolutely call it beautiful.

My uncle unexpectedly lost his wife many years ago. He began to encounter declining health too, and his enthusiasm for many things waned, including the 911. It sat in his garage, undriven, for about 10 years. Its last set of tires was 10-years old and they were only driven for 200 miles.

For about a year and a half I had pleaded with him to sell me the car. My plan was for him get the necessary restoration done in a Chicago area shop, and I'd fly up and drive it to Hickory. He said we'd make that happen, but he never could decide on a price or a shop. Time dragged on and his declining health overcame him before he got anywhere close to selling me the 911.

He and my aunt had four sons, none of whom, shockingly, wanted the car. They decided to sell it through the estate. One cousin, who was the estate executor, knew my interest in the car. He, however, had a friend who also wanted to buy it. The two of us exchanged bids for a few weeks before the other bidder dropped out at a price that was still well below the fully restored value.

I knew my cousin had no interest in researching restoration shops in the Chicago area. Plus, the idea of watching over the refurbishment at a local reputable shop sounded better than taking a flyer on a shop several states away. Bowman Vintage Restorations here in Hickory was at the top of everybody's list when I inquired. Cody Bowman, BVR's owner, did an apprenticeship under Ralph "Mutt" Brawley in the Lake Norman area. Mutt is on the Mt. Rushmore of Porsche restoration, and Cody has attained a great reputation. Cody and I met at his shop after sharing email photos of the car. He told me the extraordinary paint color added significant value to the car and was eager to bring it back to life.

To get started, however, I needed a title. Title transfer should be simple, but from multiple states away, not necessarily so. My cousin obtained some legal document allowing him to transact estate business and sent it, the Illinois title, and the required North Carolina forms to me. With those, an NC title application, and proof of insurance, I entered the NC DMV gauntlet.

The nice young DMV agent read all the forms, then called over her supervisor to do the same. They both said that since my aunt's name was also on the title, my cousin needed a similar document to transact business for her estate. I explained her estate had long since been settled and that all her property had been transferred to my uncle. They wouldn't buy that but offered to get an opinion from BIG DMV in Raleigh. Unfortunately, Raleigh concurred.

So back to Illinois for another form. After a couple weeks my cousin produced it, and I'm back to the DMV line. This time perusal of all the paper stack resulted in smiles from the agent, a promise that the NC title would be on the way in several weeks, and a temporary tag. With her help, I submitted an application for a Wake Forest custom tag. I was quite surprised when she told me 911 on a Wake Forest tag was still available. Of course, that was the obvious first choice for a Wake grad and classic 911 owner.

Now to get a 911 to Hickory. I sent a check to the estate and Cody sent a trailer to Glen Ellyn, IL. On February 24, the trailer pulled into BVR with a dusty but beautiful Porsche onboard, my first ever sight of her.

Accompanying the car was a large box my cousin had found with it. It contained every document ever generated on the car:

original sale papers, sale papers when my uncle bought it from the first owner, every service ever performed, all the tires and other parts ever bought, registration documents from Illinois, old plates, notes on the car's performance, and things I'd have never thought to keep. I may yet find tire pressure readings! There was also a library of nearly every repair manual and 911 book ever published. My uncle obsessively adored that car.

Cody soon assessed the car and produced a needed parts list. Certainly, all the fluids had to be changed. New tires were ordered – a shame with only 200 miles on those that came with it, but after ten years, no other choice. He ordered all new suspension parts, an upgrade kit for the air conditioning system, many new seals and gaskets for places that tend to leak after idle time, battery, master cylinder, fuel pump, rotors and brake pads, spark plugs, and lots of other stuff I know about only vaguely. He was ready to work as soon as the new parts arrived. I was even more ready!

Cody's team washed the 10 years of dust off, and this is what was underneath:

I think a younger version of Ms. Roseannadanna works for the NC DMV. A couple weeks after submitting my custom tag application, I noticed the fee had been refunded to my credit card. Humm? A couple more weeks and I got a form letter listing all the reasons custom tags are denied. I surely didn't consider "911" to be obscene, offensive, or vulgar, but I soon realized I'd get to make another trip to the DMV office.

There, the agent couldn't actually tell my why "911" was denied. She speculated it was because I had put an "F" before 911. I explained to her, as her office had told me when we applied, all Wake Forest custom plates were required to start with "F"! Their rules, not mine. My bet is simply that it's the emergency call code – better than any guess she had. We went down my list and, after a few weeks, this came by mail:

Cody's team set to work. New this, new that, vital fluids instilled, all seemed good, and my anticipation was heightened by the day. She was coming to my garage sooner than I thought!

But then the ghost of Roseanne began to speak, "... it just goes to show you, it's always something – if it's not one thing, it's another."

Apparently fuel pumps for G50 911s are scarce. It took several weeks to get one to Hickory. With it in place the engine still didn't run. Injectors were clogged. Solvent and careful cleaning brought the breath of life to the boxer 6. That sound and seeing the fan spinning probably brought the biggest smile to my face of anything in the whole restoration process.

But it's always something! The aftermarket radio, the only nonoriginal part, unexpectedly didn't work. A new one with a very classic look brought music to our ears. After all the AC upgrades were installed, the old compressor vomited oil all over the engine compartment when the belt was attached. A new one was much easier to find than a fuel pump but still took a while. Brake lines wouldn't bleed completely at first, but bleed they finally

did. Fuel gauge wouldn't move when gasoline was added to the tank, but a few skillful taps by Cody and the needle moved properly. On the first real drive to get the wheels aligned, the speedometer only read "zero". Was [Heisenberg's Uncertainty Principle](#) operative since we knew where the car was?

"... if it's not one thing, it's another." The speed sensor on the final drive that talks to the speedometer seemed fine. More skillful tapping failed to revive it either. It had to be sent off to a place that rehabs old instruments.

An interesting aside: from the day the 911 arrived at his shop, Cody said almost everybody who came in was enamored by the car, attracted mainly to the color. Several asked if they could buy it. One liked it so much, he was determined to find one he actually could buy. He located one with the same paint, an '87 Targa, in California and had it shipped to Hickory, sight-unseen.



While both these Cassis Red Metallic cars were at BVR together, Cody and I wondered if his shop might be the only place on the planet where two cars of that rare color were parked together. We have proof that it happened in Hickory:

A couple new resistors and one gear replaced that was worn to near the failing point and the speedometer was all good. It nestled back into its spot in the cluster about a week and a half after being shipped off.

The next "something" to pop up was from my end of the deal. Even though I'm retired, once a year I spend two full days at the PA School at Wake Forest teaching students the basics of delivering a baby. Two days out of 365, and those were the first two days after the speedometer was back in place. Another delay, but much shorter than getting a fuel pump shipped in from Planet Hoth!

So, after all the circuitous legal hoops, the convoluted restoration process, scarce replacement parts, and the seemingly endless "somethings", this classic beauty finally came to my garage on the morning of June 7. Before leaving Cody's shop she got a coat of Pinnacle Souveran Carnauba and looked drop-dead gorgeous. And, yes, my [V1 G2](#) quickly found its place on the windshield because I figured she might well get "noticed" by the wrong people! New wax, of course, and as soon as I backed out of Cody's garage, it started to rain! Some good fortune did occur: later that day the V1 G2 warned me well ahead of an instant-on radar on I-40. The next day she was in her very first car show, sponsored by Porsche of Hickory.

She is now perfect except for only one thing: my uncle had never christened her. There was only one name in my mind. She shall forever be Roseanne!

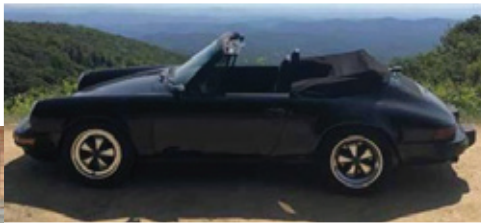

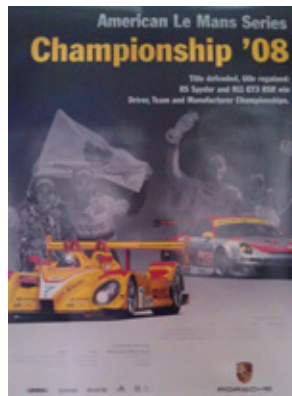

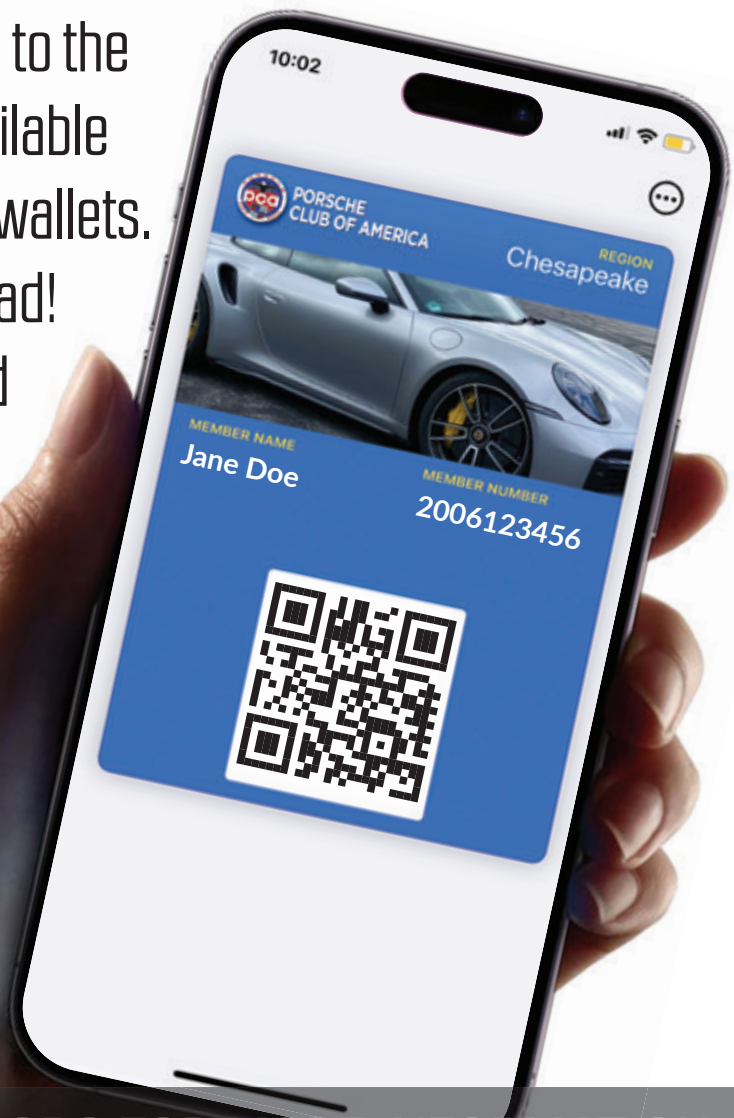
