





Greetings fellow track enthusiasts!

Wow....2023 came and went! Our season close event at VIR in November was a huge success thanks to our region participants who come and make the events enjoyable. It takes a team to make track events happen, and these could not go on without the efforts of Dale Moses as DE Co-Chair, Shane Tisdale & Colin Graidage as Co-Chief Instructors, Andy Shoun & Maurice Perea as Registrars, Les Stabler, Herbert Boehm, & Rodney Fossum doing tech inspection, and Jerry Widner & Jason Herman providing excellent classroom experiences. Jay McArdle volunteers as our Track Ambassador, spreading his winning smile and enthusiasm for track camaraderie all around the paddock. There's a whole host of family members that join in along with these folks, and I'd like to thank them profusely for their time and experience.

Weather for the November VIR event was spectacular! It has ranged from low 20s in the past, through upper 60s and raining the whole weekend. This year, event weather was everything a track addict could ask for, with cooler but comfortable temps in the morning and a mild afternoon. There was a spat of rain that came across overnight as well as a light shower Sunday that left a couple of absolutely gorgeous rainbows east of the track, including a double rainbow that was pretty hard to capture on camera.



Track Experience continues to introduce new folks to the experience of HPDE without the commitment of prepping and driving their cars. This format allows participants or their guests over the age of 18 to see what being on track at speed is like. Look in ClubRegistration at www.clubregistration.net and find the next Track Experience sessions. If you've ever wondered what it's like, this is the best way to experience it. The Track Experience pairs you with a senior instructor who will drive in the beginner group at their pace. After an introductory discussion about what HPDE is as well as the risks involved, you'll head out on track in the instructor's car. They'll cover flagging stations, passing etiquette, track vehicle dynamics, and vision on track. The region has helmets, so all you need to bring is yourself dressed appropriately (see details in the event) and we provide the rest!

This year we're doing our mid-winter seminar at VIR on Sunday February 4th. This format is a bit more relaxed than Track Experience, is free to anyone who wishes to participate, and gets you on track driving your car at highway speeds. We'll have a presentation about HPDE, open discussion of questions that you might have, and then follow up with some highway speed laps. This event is intended for folks who've never done HPDE before but are thinking about it as a complementary activity to AutoCross or just a dip into what our cars can do. Attendance at the seminar earns you \$100 your first DE registration during 2024 as well!

The biggest question that I always get around starting in HDPE is, "What all do I need to buy?" The answer is surprisingly little! At the most basic level you need an SA rated helmet which can cost as little as \$300 and an inspected car. Any dealer can inspect your make of car but there are many independent shops with the capabilities to perform inspections. Cost of this inspection varies depending on where you go, but expect from \$100-250 for the car to be put on a lift and the mechanicals thoroughly checked out. Some wear items might be flagged during the inspection, so it's always better to plan on getting it done on the early side of the now six week window before the event. Other than that, natural fiber clothing, close toed shoes, and a willing attitude will get you on track. Oh, that and the registration fee! PCA is one of the few organizations that accept SUVs in other groups than beginner, but you don't need a Porsche to come to a PCA HPDE event.

Upcoming events should be checked on ClubRegistration.net. Events planned for this year include the midwinter seminar mentioned above on Sunday February 4th at VIR, March 9-10th at CMP, September 7-8th at CMP, October 18-20th with the Club Race at CMP, and November 15-17th at VIR. Anyone can come check out the DE free of charge, talking to those in the paddock and even joining our beginner classroom sessions to get more familiar if you don't want to commit to anything. So if any of our activities are interesting to you, please consider coming to check them out, and we'll see you at the track!

Sunday morning we packed up for the long drive home and so happy to have made so many new friends.








