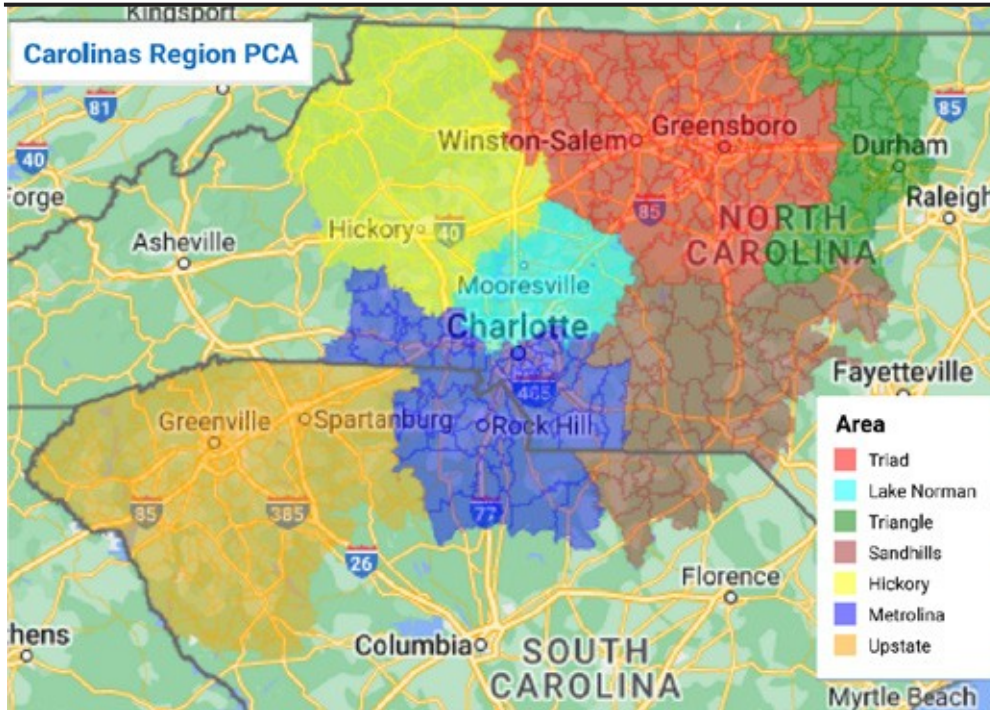

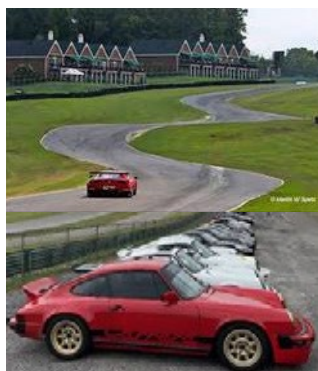

After finishing 2023 on a high note with our popular Christmas Party at PYC, we skipped the January monthly meeting. Our next meeting will be hosted by David van Epps at Sonderwerks in Cornelius on Thursday, February 8th.

As mentioned in my previous communications, your LKN AD participated for the first time in a DE at VIR this past November. As promised, in the following is a recap of my experience:

I had planned to participate in a DE for a long while. However, life and some inertia tend to get in the way of our plans from time to time, don't they?!

My journey started by researching the PCA website for additional information on DEs as well as talking to experienced track folks in the Club. I also spoke with our friends at GMP, in particular Quentin, who is a very experienced racer. Of course, I must mention Colin Graidage, co-chief instructor for the Carolinas, as he encouraged me with his subtle British persistence over the course of several months to participate in the November DE.



Cayman ready to go

Since I am very particular about my 991, I did not want to expose it to a weekend of me abusing it on the track. Secondly, I also wanted to drive a track ready Porsche at VIR that would offer state-of-the-art protection. Luckily, GMP had the perfect car for me, namely their 2014 Cayman S: not only is it an all around well balanced car featuring a PDK, track brakes and suspension, and a performance tune but it also sports a roll cage, race seats, and five point harness seat belts. For a little fee (spoiler alert: DEs & tracking your Porsche does require some funds), I was able to rent the Cayman for the DE weekend, have it shipped to VIR (please see photo) and enjoy the full GMP track support. I call this the celebrity approach: all I had to do was to drive myself to VIR, everything else was taking care of. This included all the necessary paperwork and the onsite tech inspection that every participant has to pass prior to the DE event. Especially for somebody new to DEs, this all-inclusive GMP package offers great convenience and peace of mind. Of course, there is still the DE Guide and a few other items that participants should be reading ahead of the

DE event, e.g. knowing the various flags and their meanings. I arrived by late afternoon on Friday at VIR, in order to familiarize myself with the lay of the land and to sign off on some paperwork. GMP had a large trailer onsite with a huge tent extending their footprint (please see photo). There were also several other Porsche enthusiasts, who had also signed up for GMP's track support for the weekend. Just marveling at some of the GT3RS and GT4RS parked right inside the GMP tent was almost worth the trip (I said almost!).

Most importantly, on Friday I met up with my instructor for the weekend, you may have guessed, our British DE gentleman, ex-racer, and current co-chief instructor for the Carolinas, Colin Graidage. He was brave enough, to volunteer to endure a total of seven race sessions instructing me over the course of the following two days (please see photo).

Luckily, the weather cooperated for the DE weekend and we had sunny, dry conditions, albeit a little chilly in the morning – but it was Mid-November in VA after all. After the obligatory drivers' meeting early Saturday morning, the Green group that I was in had its first classroom instruction. Our instructor, Jason Herman (under the supervision of Jerry Widner) made us feel very welcome and was quite helpful teaching us the track basics and preparing us mentally for our sessions that were to follow. He stressed the 3 goals for us for this weekend, namely: 1. Be Safe, 2. Learn, 3. Have Fun. Now looking back, I can't emphasize how helpful the three classroom sessions were - we literally put all that we just learned right into action on a great racetrack!

Here is my recap on those three aforementioned goals:
Be Safe: My GMP Cayman S had all the safety goodies you want to have (please see photo). Wearing a five point harness, an approved helmet, and a HANS device, not only provided great safety but it made me feel almost like a real racer (I also used race gloves compliments of Quentin). Of course, following all of the instructor's directions when out on

the track is a paramount. Always paying attention to the cars in front of you (and behind you) and the flag stations is also an absolute must for safe driving. And that DEs are not the same as driving VIR in a simulator was certainly clear after the first session...

DEs are not races and in the green group passing is first of all limited to three straightaways and secondly in order to do so one has "to present oneself" (i.e. get close to the car in front of you) and then the other driver, acknowledges and then points his/her hand outside the driver's window in the appropriate direction (left or right depending on track location) so that the faster car may safely pass.

Learn: The classroom instructions were very helpful for me as I experienced quickly after my first few track sessions that driving a track at high speed requires a basic understanding of geometry and physics. Geometry because speed is all about finding the best line, e.g. tracking out wide so that one can drive in a straight line into the next turn (e.g. turn 1 and 2 at VIR). Physics because we want to approach a curve as fast as we can, then decelerate to a speed we feel comfortable we can keep the car on the track throughout the curve. Simply put, it's all about making sure the frictional forces (your tires) keeping you on the track are larger than the centrifugal forces that want to take you off the track... Braking and applying gas ("give it some throttle") at the right time and in the right track location are key to above. The GMP Cayman S is equipped with the beautiful PDK which I highly recommend to any newbie as it allows you to focus on braking, steering, and "giving it throttle".

Have Fun: The entire weekend was exhilarating!

Colin Graidage was a fantastic instructor throughout the weekend. Every instructor is connected via an earpiece and microphone with his student to allow on track communication (have I mentioned that DEs are rather loud?!?). Colin communicated with me continuously in the first several sessions: he pretty much guided me through every curve and straightaway. "Turn in", "brake", "track out wide", "give it some throttle", etc. certainly started making sense to me after a few sessions. Colin made sure that I always drove safely but he also pushed me hard to drive the optimum line (even when I was at first sometimes hesitating), taught me the best braking points (those numbers ahead of curves are there for a reason), the best turn-in points (ditto for the arrows), and throttle usage. While all these actions might have been a little mechanical in the beginning, the more track time I got under my belt the more I started to feel the car respond to these actions and

the more I could hear Colin approving of my driving. What might have helped me the most was when Colin took me out on the track a few times in his 991 in the Blue Group (one level above Green, i.e. fairly experienced DE drivers). Riding shotgun with such an experienced driver showed me where I was "Bleeding" time, e.g. braking points, turn ins, improved line, throttle usage, etc.

Of course, after each of these learning experiences I was eager to apply my newly gained knowledge to the racetrack. Yes, DE is not racing, but I would lie if I said that I enjoyed having to let somebody pass because they were faster... I was very happy to be able to shave off over 22 seconds from my best lap time during my first session as compared to my seventh, and last session on Sunday (please see photo).

The GMP Cayman is equipped with a center mounted camera that is speed activated and displays important parameters such as speed, time, rpms, G-Force, and brake and throttle usage. Hence, I was able to watch all my sessions at home afterwards which is helpful and a great memory.

Summarizing this weekend: it was an absolute blast! Will I do it again: that's the plan!!! (please see photo)

Would I recommend to my fellow PCA members to participate in a DE? Absolutely! If you have never done one, what are you waiting for? And not having a dedicated racecar is no excuse: as mentioned earlier renting a prepared racecar with track support as I did, ensures a stress free experience especially if you are new to DEs.

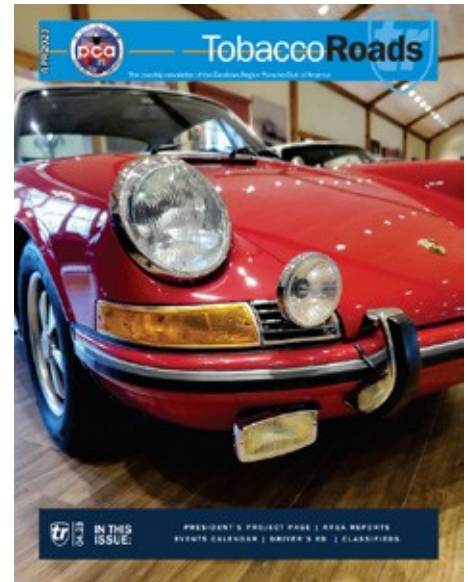
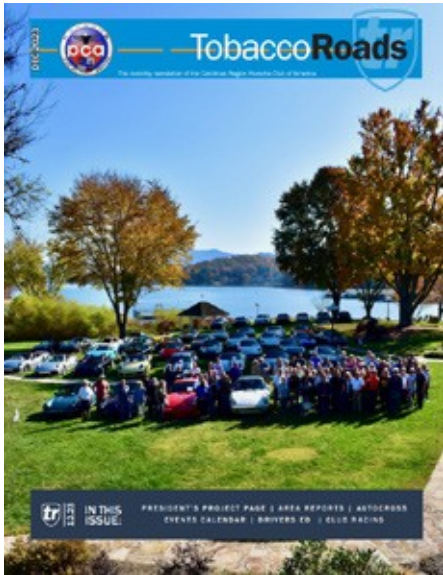
Part of the annual tradition is the "Best of the Year" as decided by the readers...subsequently, I asked for your votes on Best of the Year – 2023 and here are the results:

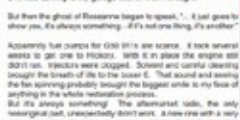

As the Carolinas Region Board of Directors (The Board) understand and share YOUR Passion for Tobacco Roads Newsletter. It is deeply engrained into the fabric of our great Region since 1969 - AND WILL REMAIN. Please read on to see our announcement.

History:

The Carolinas Region was formed in December of 1961 and our original communication to its members was in the form of a brief interpretation of the word newsletter named Probe Panther Mail P.C.A. Carolinas. This format was used until 1964 when it was changed to the Carolinas News Letter. This was the first time a multiple stapled magazine type of newsletter was used. It ended in 1992. The end of the Carolinas News Letter was only the beginning of what we know today as Tobacco Roads for 1993.

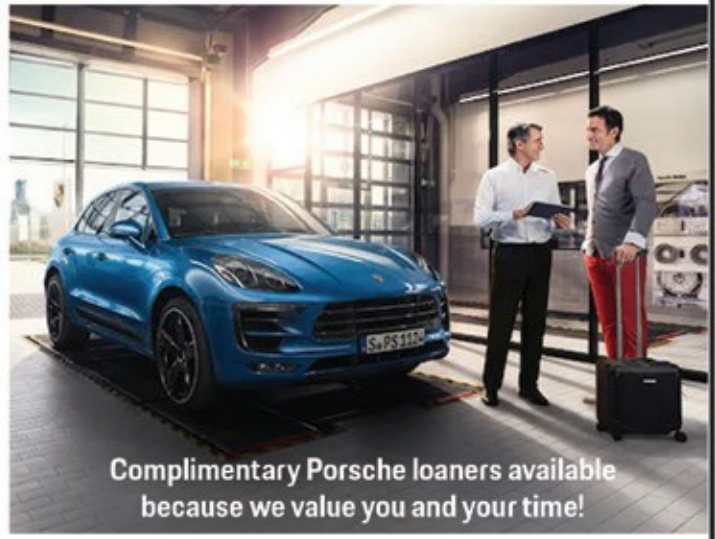

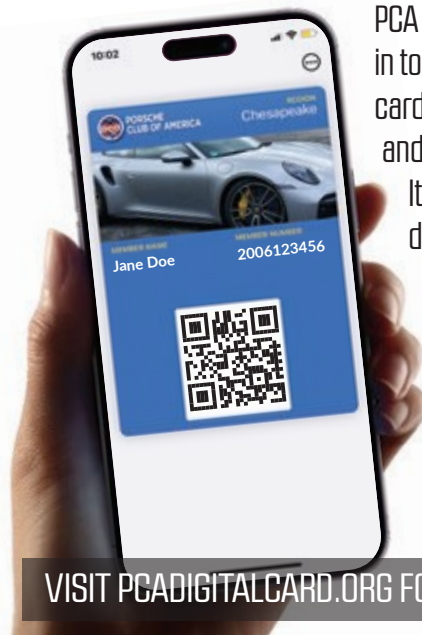
