



DUTIES/EXPECTATIONS/ITEMS TO CONSIDER:

Nominated officers are; President, Vice President, Secretary & Treasurer.

Duties of the Officers listed above are found in Article VI: Duties of Officers (Section 1 through Section 4) of the Carolinas Region BYLAWS, Revised April 2021. (Full document available on Carolinas Region Website).

The elected officers of President and Vice President shall have a term of two years and shall begin on January 1, 2025, and end on December 31, 2026. If considered for reelection upon completion of the two-year term, may serve an additional two years for a total of four consecutive years in the same office. Those nominations shall agree to these dates and fulfill their obligations upon successful election by the Region Membership.

The elected officers of Secretary and Treasurer shall serve their term of two years to begin on January 1, 2025, and end on December 31, 2026. If considered for reelection upon completion of the two-year term, may serve additional terms. There are no term limitations for the Secretary or Treasury roles.




Tobacco Roads APPLE BLOSSOM








Sandhills Area





My First Driver's Ed By Martin Salas



Back in September I wrote an article on my first Porache Driving Experience. After much consideration, I decided that it was time to move ahead and go to my first Driver's Ed.






