



Tobacco Roads Porsche @ Le Mans

It's June, and that means its time for the 24hrs of Le Mans. Usually held in the middle of the month, this race is now heading into its second century with the 100th event held last year. The Circuit de la Sarthe is roughly eight and a half miles in length, and it has undergone 11 modifications since the Le Mans race began. Early in his career Dr. Porsche knew he would sell more cars by winning races, and thus racing became integral to the brand. Why is Le Mans so special to Porsche, because no other manufacture has more overall wins then Porsche.

The journey began in the early 1950s. In 1951, a modest Porsche 356 SL, a lightweight, aerodynamic version of



Everything changed in 1970. The Porsche 917, an engineering marvel with its flat-12 engine and striking design, roared onto the scene. Led by drivers Hans Herrmann and Richard Attwood, the 917 dominated the race, securing Porsche's first overall victory at Le Mans. This triumph was followed by another win in 1971, establishing the 917 as a legend in motorsport history.

The 1970s and 80s saw Porsche solidify its dominance at Le Mans. The 936 prototype, with its turbocharged

their road car, made its debut at Le Mans. Against all odds, the little car from Stuttgart clinched a class victory, marking Porsche's first taste of success at the legendary circuit. It was a sign of things to come.

Throughout the 1950s and 60s, Porsche steadily climbed the ranks, experimenting with various designs and technologies. The 550 Spyder, driven by the likes of Hans Herrmann and Richard von Frankenberg, became a fan favorite, showcasing Porsche's relentless innovation and determination. Despite several class victories and podium finishes, the overall win at Le Mans remained elusive.



engine and agile handling, clinched victories in 1976, 1977, and 1981. But it was the iconic Porsche 956 and its successor, the 962, that truly cemented Porsche's place in the annals of Le Mans history. From 1982 to 1987, Porsche reigned supreme, winning six consecutive races. Drivers like Jacky Ickx, Derek Bell, and Hans-Joachim Stuck became synonymous with Porsche's success, pushing the cars to their limits and beyond.





The 1990s brought new challenges and fierce competition, but Porsche remained a formidable force. In 1994, a modified version of the 962, the Dauer 962 Le Mans, took victory. This was followed by a dramatic win in 1996 with the Porsche WSC-95, and in 1998, the Porsche 911 GT1-98 secured yet another triumph, marking Porsche's 16th overall victory at Le Mans.



The return was nothing short of spectacular. In 2015, the 919 Hybrid clinched Porsche's 17th overall win at Le Mans, followed by consecutive victories in 2016 and 2017. These triumphs not only showcased Porsche's technological prowess but also its enduring spirit and passion for racing.

As the years rolled on, Porsche's legacy at Le Mans continued to inspire new generations of engineers, drivers, and fans. With a total of 19 overall victories by 2023, Porsche remains the most successful manufacturer in the history of



As the new millennium dawned, Porsche shifted focus to the development of its road cars and other motorsport endeavors. However, the call of Le Mans was too strong to resist. In 2014, after a 16-year absence, Porsche returned to the top-tier prototype category with the 919 Hybrid. This innovative car, combining a turbocharged V4 engine with cutting-edge hybrid technology, signaled Porsche's commitment to both performance and sustainability.



the 24 Hours of Le Mans. You can see the 919 at the Porsche Experience Center in Atlanta. I was amazed at how low to ground the car stands.

My favorite Le Mans Story happened a several of years back. I was sitting on an airplane ready to take off, and the pilot announced, "Well we have to all in maintenance, there is burned out light bulb." This was at 6 Am in the morning. It was father's day, there was some sort of contract dispute between the pilots union and the airline. So how long could that take, well 3 hours, but luckily, I was streaming the Le Mans Race on my phone. The race was dominated by Toyota Gazoo racing, but on the last lap, their hybrid system failed. The driver got the car restarted, but the #2 Porsche crossed the line ahead of it. After 24 hrs of racing, and pushing the cars to their limits, it came down to the last 1/2 of a lap really. It was exciting to see, and a good way to spend my morning waiting on some poor tech to be called in on Father's day. This year's race dates: June 15-16






